





I like to add I know how the following (International Space Station, Satellite, Comet, Meteorite, aeroplane and helicopter) appear in the night sky.


I have searched for time tables of flight plans for International Space Station, Satellite, Comets and Meteorite events for this time at night and found nothing.


This was not like anything I've observed before it's unbelievable that I've seen this over Newcatle upon Tyne.
