Above noted subject sighted an unidentified object on the above noted date. Same was sighted in the southwest sky by himself and family.

The sighting was at approximately 6:50 p.m. M.D.T.. Sky conditions at the time were clear with few clouds. Sun was very low on the horizon. The location of sighting was one mile west of Drayton Valley, Alberta. Subject described object as being one to two feet in length, six inches deep, gold in color, with a trail of fire out rear. At time of sighting, observer was looking directly into sunset. Object appeared to be approximately 5 miles away.

A neighbour of captionally noted, Lenard MORRILL, Box 1411, Drayton Valley, Alberta also viewed same sighting at approximately same hour. Reliability of both witnesses is good.

On Saturday, 16 October 1977, at about six or six fifteen in the afternoon, I came into the house and sat down at the kitchen table. The kitchen of our mobile home has a window facing to the west and I noticed that the sun was in the process of setting on the horizon. As the sun was going down, I observed an egg shaped object, longer than it was round, with a tail flame, in the sky in the same general direction as the sun was setting. The object appeared to be moving from north to south and appeared to be at a great distance from our trailer and the horizon. I watched it for 15 to 30 minutes. While I was watching the object in the sky, 4 jets came from the east and appeared to be following it. They didn't appear to be able to catch up to it and then the object disappeared in the south east, burning as it went out of sight.

(phone 542-4535) taken on the 23 OCT 77 at 12 noon.

On the 16 OCT 77 at approximately 6:50 p.m., I was eating supper when my boy, SHAUN came in and said he saw something fly over the house. So I went outside and looked and saw an object approximately 1½ to 2 ft. in length and 6" - 1 ft. thick. It was over in the south west moving the same direction. I watched it for about ½ a minute to one minute. It was sort of a golden color. My son told me it had lazer beam coming out of rear. But by this time, it was too far for me to see. It was going too straight of flight to be meteor, I felt. The sun was in more of west direction and the object was moving in a south westerly direction. After I phoned RCMP, the object was gone. I couldn't see any lights flashing but from the distance away it was, it appeared to be a fairly large object. It wasn't the shape of an airplane. It was oblong in shape. Soviets see spots in sky

MOSCOW (UPI) — The Soviet press reported yesterday a mysterious moving ball of light was seen over Petrozavodsk in Soviet Karelia about the same time a similar spectacle was sighted over neighboring Finland.

The official Soviet news agency Tass said that at approximately 4 a.m. Tuesday "a huge star suddenly flashed out of a dark sky sending shafts of light impulses to earth."

"This star was moving slowly towards Petrozavodsk and spreading over it like a jellyfish," Tass said. "It stopped and hovered over the city, sending out numerous thin light rays like a downpour of rain."

"Sometime later the illumination ended. The jellyfish turned into a bright semicircle and resumed its movement toward Onega Lake, the horizon of which was covered with grey clouds. Then there formed in this shroud a semicircular glow, bright red in the middle and white on the sides. This phenomenon according to witnesses lasted from 10 to 12 minutes," Tass said.

Reports from Helsinki Tuesday said a bright ball of fire was visible for about four minutes over the Finnish capital. There was speculation there that it could have been a Soviet rocket stage burning up on re-entry or exploding.

Tass quoted Yuri Gromov, director of the Petrozavodsk meteorological observatory, as saying there were no technical experiments under way at the time and no unusual weather.

"The meteorological workers of Karelia have never before registered similar phenomena," Gromov told Tass. It remains an enigma.

"The special weather services did not register any sharp deviations in the atmosphere during 24 hours of that period."

"It is impossible to call this phenomenon some kind of mirage because any people witnessed it. Their testimony is identical in many details."

In Leningrad the Pulkova Astronomical Observatory told UPI the only thing they recorded Tuesday morning was a meteorite moving from south to north at 5 a.m.

While the Soviets charged no rent for the premises, they did make other exacting requirements. The experiments had to be self-contained and require no power and they had to fit in a small volume of space. Otherwise, the Soviets "were extremely cooperative in all dealings," and the technicians who processed the U.S. experiments at the north-central ALC recovery site after recovery on Aug. 22 were "top notch," according to Kenneth Sousa, manager of the U.S. station who escorted the samples from Moscow back to the West Coast.

The consensus of U.S. researchers that the project was successful is reiterated by Russian scientists who collaborated on four of the seven studies. Next month a U.S.-Soviet meeting will convene in California to discuss future joint biospace efforts. NASA's Harold P. Klein, director of life sciences at Ames, "It is possible they might want to fly on the shuttle." □

Soviet UFO due to secret launch

A spectacular, starlike ball of light sighted over Petrozavodsk in the northwestern Soviet Union Sept. 20, "spreading over it like a jellyfish" and showering down shafts of light, was identified last week by American analysts as the launch contrails of the Cosmos-955 spy satellite.

The sighting of the strange phenomenon, also seen over Finland, was widely reported by the Soviet news agency Tass and by news agencies around the world. "A huge star suddenly flashed out of a dark sky, sending shafts of light impulses to earth," Tass reported. "This star was moving slowly toward Petrozavodsk and spreading over it like a jellyfish. It stopped and hovered over the city, sending out numerous thin light rays like a downpour of rain." No explanation was offered in the news reports.

But the phenomenon turns out to have been due to a predawn launch from a top secret military space center north of Moscow. Although the base, the Plesetsk Cosmodrome, has been known to Western observers since shortly after it became operational in 1966, Moscow has

never admitted that it exists, presumably due to sensitivity about its military nature. Soviet officials continue to maintain that all Russian space shots are launched from the Baykonur Cosmodrome near Tyuratam in central Asia, with a few additional small satellites launched from a minor test range on the lower Volga River. But American observers say Plesetsk is the busiest spaceport on earth, accounting for 40 percent of all the world's space launches. Tass placed itself in a potentially embarrassing situation by reporting the UFO: To explain the sighting would be to reveal the existence of the base.

The identification of the Soviet UFO as the Cosmos-955 spy satellite was made by James E. Oberg, a space specialist in Houston who is both a well-known authority on the Russian space program and an investigator of UFO reports. He is also a member of the recently formed UFO subcommittee of the private Committee for the Scientific Investigation of Claims of the Paranormal, which last week issued his report explaining the sighting.

"As soon as I read the newspaper reports, I thought of a rocket launching," Oberg says. "I made a phone call to a friend of mine who keeps records of Russian satellites, and sure enough, I found that two satellites had been launched that morning." Calculations based on orbital predictions issued by NASA's Goddard Space Flight Center in Greenbelt, Md., enabled Oberg to determine that the missile had blasted off a few minutes before 4 a.m. local time. The reports from Petrozavodsk, which is about 200 miles southwest of Plesetsk, began at 4 a.m. The satellite was launched toward the northeast, thus, says Oberg, providing the surprised witnesses with a spectacular view right up the exhaust plumes. "The identification," he adds, "is 100 percent certain."

Nighttime rocket launchings in the United States have often resulted in UFO reports because the expanding vapor trail sometimes glows in the dark and can assume odd shapes.

Oberg says this is only the fourth time that a launch from Plesetsk has had just the right conditions of azimuth, high altitude, booster and darkness to produce an awesome visual display. In one case, the launch of the Meteor 2 weather satellite in October 1969, dozens of eyewitness reports came in from observers in Finland and Sweden. An amateur astronomical society in Helsinki collected the reports and later published drawings of the phenomenon.

The vivid descriptions of this latest sighting are virtually identical to the Finnish reports about the Meteor 2 launch eight years ago. The mysterious tentacles, or "shafts of light," Oberg says, were in fact the separate vapor trails left by the four parallel booster units attached to the core rocket stage. "Films of Soviet rocket launchings show this 'shaft of light' effect clearly." □

They advised that Mrs. Doreen HAWES, 23 Hillside Drive, Yellowknife, N.W.T. phoned their office asking if any aircraft were presently flying. When they advised that they had no record of an airborne aircraft, she stated she had seen a light in the sky to the S.E. of Yellowknife.

She was contacted by our office and she described the light as looking like a star at first and then emitting a flashing red light. It was stationary for approximately one minute and then moved off in a south westerly direction at an undetermined speed. It was visible for a total time of approximately two minutes.


Present with Mrs. HAWES, at the time of the sighting, was her 13 year old son, Ross HAWES.

Since Hay River is south of Yellowknife, the Hay River Airport was contacted to see if they had any aircraft flying in their area and as far as they knew there were no airborne craft.

I spoke with Aeradio and they stated that it is quite possible for an aircraft to be flying locally and for them not to know about it, especially if it is not landing at the airport. In view of this, it is felt that what Mrs. HAWES saw was a private aircraft flying without having notified any of the local Aeradio authorities.

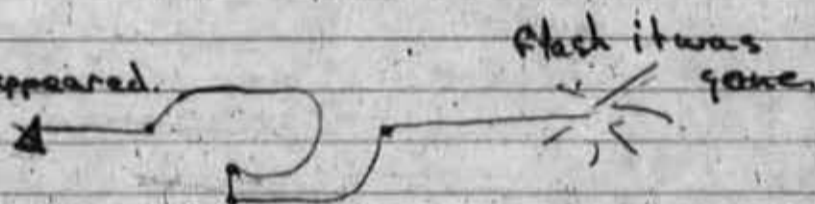

- At approximately 12:45 AM, 18 DEC 77, Sandor SZELL, 40 years old, and his son Sandor SZELL Jr., 14 years old, sighted an unidentified flying object 5 1/2 miles north on secondary highway 743 and one mile west of Peace River, Alta. The sighting occurred on Mountain Standard time and the sky conditions were clear.
- SZELL, and his son were travelling in their vehicle when the object was spotted. He stopped his vehicle and the object was at 10 oclock. He drove his vehicle west thirty meters and the object was at 11 oclock indicating to him that the object was stationary and not more that a thousand feet in the air. SZELL and his son then got out of the vehicle and observed the object for 30 seconds. The object remained stationary for that period of time and then moved straight west at a tremendous speed and then disappeared. Szell described the object as oval shaped, bright yellow in color and brighter in the centre with blue/green haze around the edges. It appeared to be 4 feet in diameter and made no sound. There was no trail from it when motion. SZELL stated that it was not a comet, falling star or lights from an airplane.
- In interviewing SZELL it was evident that he is an intelegent and credible individual. There is no doubt in this members mind that SZELL and his son did in fact see the object as described.
- No other sightings were reported in this area. The Peace River airport was contacted and they advise that there were no aircraft in that area at that time. No explanation can be found at this point for the objects presence and it is not felt that any further investigation by this office will offer any useful conclusions.

dropping in on our set, and McLean would always single out a pretty girl from the guests, come over to me and say, 'Father, I met this girl. Will you marry us?'

"Or he'd do his confessions. McLean would throw himself in front of me on his knees and begin to tell all the terrible things he'd done."

Although silliness does occur during filming, Christopher revealed that actor Alan Alda, who plays the zany, quick-witted Hawkeye Pierce, is not really like Hawkeye in real life.

"Alan's a funny guy, and he says a lot of funny things — but it's not his interest to sit around the 'M*A*S*H' set and get laughs.

"He's the most generous star — and he really is a star. He's got a lot of clout on the show because he is recognized as being exceptional, brilliant and gifted as an actor, writer and director.

"Alan is relaxed in his star-

dom, secure in his stardom." Christopher recalled a special moment on "M*A*S*H" when actor Gary "Radar" Burghoff's love for animals stopped the filming.

"A horse was supposed to be

tranquilized so he would lie down. Gary became very upset," recalled Christopher. He said it wasn't good for the horse.

"Burghoff really put his foot down. He even got on the

phone and called our producer. We had to cancel shooting that day because Gary refused to work until they got a horse that was trained to lie down."

Between takes on the set, "M*A*S*H" stars read and talk. "And there's always a traveling Scrabble game, maintained by Alan and Mike 'B.J. Hunnicutt' Farrell," said Christopher who — true to his character — always carries a book of Greek to study.

Recently, Christopher came down with hepatitis — and "M*A*S*H" writers centered the show around his illness.

"They had written a show called 'Hepatitis,' but decided they'd drop it," he said. "When I got hepatitis, they revived it and rewrote it so I'd be the one on the show who had hepatitis.

"They sent me the script when I was sick. It arrived all typed on yellow paper and bound in a yellow cover. Then when I got back to work, they had painted my chair... a beautiful yellow!"

Housewife Turns Homemade Salads Into a \$12-Million-a-Year Business

The first time Grace Kinser sold a batch of her homemade salads she made \$30. Last year she made \$12 million.

It's been 30 years since she launched her business venture and, in that time, her "kitchen" has expanded into an empire.

The 67-year-old Atlanta, Ga., housewife and mother is chairman of the-board of Mrs. Kinser's Home Style Foods — a well-known prepared-food company in the southeastern U.S.

"In my wildest imagination I never dreamed that the Lord had this in mind for me," said the energetic, devout Baptist who sold her first batch of ham salad, chicken salad and pimento cheese salad in 1948.

"At that time," she recalled, "salad was only sold in open trays, and I'd had an idea to sell it in airtight transparent

After contacting several container companies, Mrs. Kinser found one that was able to supply her with the cups. "The night I did my first batch of homemade salad, everyone in the family pitched in. My two daughters and my husband rolled up their sleeves

and got to work."

They made 90 cups of salad, which Mrs. Kinser sold to independent grocers in her neighborhood. Her enterprise grew so quickly, she soon had to hire outside help.

"In 1950, I left the kitchen and expanded into my garage. In 1951, I left the garage and rented a building," she said.

Then came a big contract to supply her prepared salads to a national food chain — and business really soared.

Today, Mrs. Kinser operates three plants and employs 175 people, who make 15 different types of prepared salads.

Summing up her philosophy of climbing to the top, she says: "My father taught me very early in life never to give up. He told me the story of two frogs. Each one hopped into a gallon of milk.

"One floundered around, gave up and died. The other kept on kicking, and next day he was floating on a pound of butter, alive and well.

"That's the kind of philosophy I've stuck by. Even when the cards have been stacked against me, I've never given up."

UFOs Linked to Blasts That Rocked East Coast

The mysterious atmospheric blasts that have rocked much of the East Coast have been linked to a series of amazing UFO sightings that occurred about the same time.

"The link between these mystery explosions and UFOs is the most exciting new development in this field," declared noted UFO researcher Robert Creegan, a professor of philosophy at the State University of New York at Albany and a former member of The ENQUIRER's Blue Ribbon Panel of UFO investigators.

And Dr. James Harder, professor of engineering at the University of California at Berkeley, commented: "I think it's entirely possible that UFOs are connected to the blasts."

The high-altitude explosions — which were heard or felt in parts of Connecticut, New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina and South Carolina — have baffled defense officials and scientists.

But The ENQUIRER has learned that during the same period the explosions were occurring at least the following five UFOs appeared directly over or near the blast sites:

- A giant "arrowhead"-shaped object which hovered above a village in New York state and startled residents.
- A large silvery sphere seen suspended in midair above a high tension tower in Charleston, S.C. — at the exact moment of one of the blasts.
- A slow-moving UFO that flew above a northeastern Pennsylvania town, glowed with bright white and blue lights — then, amazingly, split in half and zoomed off in different directions.

• A mind-boggling UFO — sighted above the same Pennsylvania town — that had "two flashing red lights in front" and a cabin with 3 windows.

• A series of spectacular reddish-orange lights that whisked along the New Jersey coast and appeared to be shooting flames.

At least seven mysterious high-altitude blasts occurred in December and were picked up by the super-sensitive microphones and recording devices at Columbia University's Lamont-Doherty Geological Observatory in Palisades, N.Y.

Dr. William Donn, head of the atmospheric sciences program at the observatory, said the noises were not from nuclear blasts or from the supersonic Concorde jet.

"They're explosions of some kind, but not meteorites, I don't know the cause of them yet," said Dr. Donn, adding that the blasts were the loudest ever recorded by his instruments.

As early as November 23, a mystery bang shook the upstate New York town of Plymouth — and several residents watched in stunned amazement as a UFO flew overhead during the tremendous din.

Tom Colledge, a farmer, had

just gone to bed about 12:45 a.m. when he was jolted by the noise and ran to the window. Near his barn, only 150 feet above the ground, he saw a startling UFO. "I never saw anything like it before," he said. "You could actually hear the atmosphere around it crackling from the tremendous noise. It wasn't like a jet noise, but more like a rocket.

"It looked like an arrowhead design. And it looked like it had four engines in the back because you could see the orange fire that was in them."

He said the craft measured about 75 feet across and 75 to 80 feet long. "And it had these oscillating lights, like the lights on a police car, about four or six red ones turning around . . . and these tremendously bright white lights that were shining down."

Colledge and his wife watched as the incredible craft moved across a valley that runs flat for about 200 yards from their house. Then it disappeared beyond a hill that rises out of the valley.

Just a few minutes later, about 1 a.m., and about three miles away, Bob Travers, his wife Margaret and son Tom, 16, also heard a thunderous noise.

Travers ran to a window — and saw an amazing UFO about 500 feet off the ground. "I'd say it was darned near as big as a house. The shape was more or less like an arrowhead," said Travers, an oil burner repairman. "It had probably two or three rows of square windows on it."

Mrs. Travers — who opened the patio door to look at the UFO — added: "It had red and green lights on it and bright white lights that lit up the whole ground."

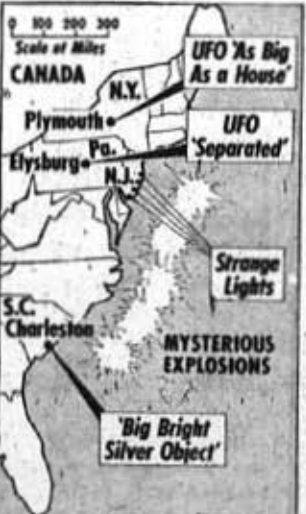
No military or commercial aircraft were in the Plymouth area at the time of those sightings, according to a spokesman for Hancock Air Force Base, which is 50 miles to the north-west of Plymouth.

The Plymouth blast was not detected by the Lamont-Doherty Geological Observatory, but Dr. Donn said his instruments pick up explosions only when the sound is carried on winds blowing in the general direction of the Observatory.

However, during the time of

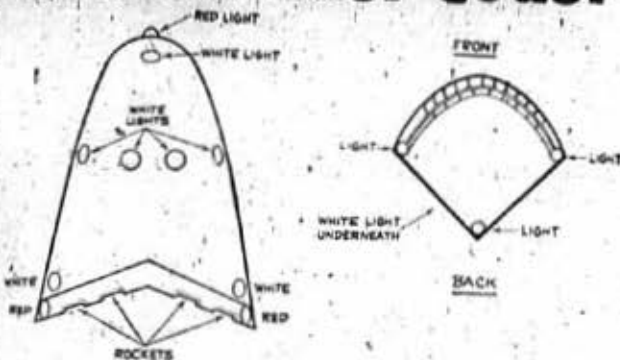
MAP of East Coast shows where the series of UFO sightings occurred, about the very same time that the mysterious explosions were heard.

the Plymouth UFO sightings, many residents reported being disturbed by the loud, rumbling noise, and their descriptions were identical to those of the later recorded blasts.

On December 2 — the day blasts were felt in Charleston, and along the New Jersey coast — mechanic William James Herrmann, 25, was jolted out of a sound sleep in his Charleston trailer home about 9:30 a.m.

"I saw a big, bright roundish silver object," he told The ENQUIRER. "It looked like it was hovering above an electrical power tower about 500 feet away. It was shimmering and looked like it was sitting in midair right above the tower."

And only 8 hours after Herrmann saw a UFO — and just 90 minutes after another mystery blast rocked New Jersey — a housewife in Elysburg, Pa., Mrs. Phyllis Crowl, and

her daughter had a close encounter with an eerie UFO moving slowly across the highway in front of her car about 200 feet above the ground.

"It had bright white lights in front and a bright blue light in the back," said Mrs. Crowl, 34. Then suddenly, she recalled, "It separated! It separated!" The blue light zoomed off in one direction, and the white one in another.

Just two nights later on December 4, near the same location, a farmer and his wife also saw something strange. "It was about 5:30 p.m.," said George W. Richard, 59. "I saw a real bright light above the tree tops across the valley. It just looked like three windows in a cabin, with a separation between each one. The windows were rather square and were one on top of another. There were two flashing red lights in the front, one above the other." Soon it disappeared beyond a hill.

On the evening of December 13, just two nights before another series of blasts thundered along the East Coast, two teenagers called Harvey Cedars patrolman John Scott and reported seeing unusual lights near the New Jersey coast.

And both Scott and police Sgt. Robert Snyder of Long Beach, N.J., say they themselves spotted strange lights in the sky that night.

"I saw them off and on for at least three quarters of an hour while I was patrolling," Scott said. "I had a pilot's license at one time, and I wouldn't describe it as a plane, definitely not."

Sgt. Snyder saw lights in the

sky that were a bright yellowish color and would appear then vanish in a few seconds. "During that night, there were a lot of what seemed like shooting stars," he said. "I don't know what they were. They lasted 4 or 5 seconds."

William Hayes, Civil Defense coordinator for Ocean County, N.J., told The ENQUIRER that a total of nine blasts were felt along the New Jersey coast between December 2 and December 21 — and during that time many people called his office to report UFO sightings.

"People were reporting these things at the same time as the blasts," said Hayes.

A Pentagon spokesman told The ENQUIRER that the Defense Dept. does not know what caused any of the mysterious atmospheric blasts and that the military had nothing to do with them.

Professor Creegan, who lectures extensively on UFOs, declared:

"Here we have the possibility of the breakthrough in UFO research that we've been looking for and expecting. So far UFOs have given us only sightings with a minimum of information about them."

And Dr. George Agogino, chairman of the department of anthropology at Eastern New Mexico University and a member of the scientific advisory board for the Society for the Investigation of the Unexplained, told The ENQUIRER:

"If these strange noises are associated with UFO sightings, it makes them all the more fascinating. The possibility exists there may be a correlation here."

White House Orders Investigation

Last December 29 the White House ordered top governmental agencies to investigate and report on the mysterious blasts that have rocked the East Coast.

So far they've been unable to explain the explosions.

The ENQUIRER checked with these agencies and was told:

Defense Dept.: "We have no knowledge or explanation for any of the reported explosions off the East Coast."

Coast Guard: "We know nothing about them. We have

no explanation whatsoever. We are at a loss to explain what it might be."

NASA: "We don't have any ideas."

National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration: "We don't know anything about them and don't have any explanation for them at this time."

Interior Dept.: "The Interior Dept. isn't doing anything other than what the Geological Survey did."

Geological Survey: "They can't be explained."

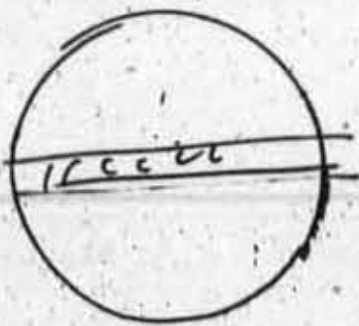

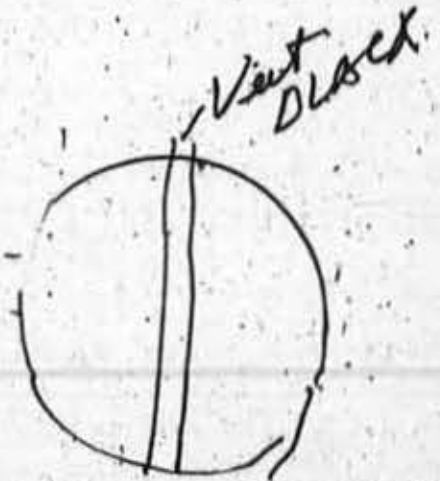

1. In reference to Telex No. 78/1 sent to the National Research Council on the 2nd of January, 1978, and in compliance with Operational Manual Sect. I.3.E.22.3.. Note the following which is an itemization of the U.F.O. sighting investigated by the Airdrie Detachment of the R.C.M.P.
2. At 9:00 p.m. Mountain Standard Time the 1st day of January, 1978 an Unidentified Flying Object was reported to have been seen two miles North of the Calgary City Limits and west of Highway #2, in the Province of Alberta.
3. The weather conditions were clear, the sky was dark, no clouds, and many stars could be seen. The sighting was within two miles of the city and therefore city lights were also in view.
4. The identity of the observers are Mr. and Mrs. Robert Daniel COADY (B. 12 JUN 52) of #704 314-14st. N.W. Calgary, Alta., Ph. # 283-0897.
5. Observers state they were travelling south on Highway #2 towards the City of Calgary, and sighted the U.F.O. about one mile or two before the City Limits, the U.F.O. was described as being approximately 1 mile west of highway #2.
6. No other persons reported seeing this U.F.O. to date.
7. Sighting is described to be a bright red light about 20 feet over top of a car, and every few seconds it would flash or get brighter, then die down and flash again. The shape was just that of a light, no real shape. The altitude is described as being 10 or 20 feet above the ground. Only one object spotted which seemed to be over top of a vehicle, like a car or truck. The movement of the object was toward the south.
8. Duration of observation - approximately ten minutes.

9. A check with Air Traffic Control at Calgary International Airport found that no other sightings had been reported and they had nothing to report. Patrols of the area revealed nothing of significance. It was noted that the North South Canadian Pacific Rail Line runs parallel to highway #2 North of the City of Calgary for several miles, and is approximately 1 mile West of highway #2. No roads are to be found in this vicinity.


A check with the Yard Master for C.P. Rail revealed that shortly before 9:00p.m. 1 JAN 78 a Rail Diesel Car travelled south along that section of tracks travelling from Edmonton to Calgary. This single car diesel engine has two headlights mounted in front and two red marker lights which are about 14 or 15 feet off the railway tracks. Also about 7 feet off the tracks and situated in front of the engine is a 10 or 12 inch white headlight which is a type of revolving strobe and has a field of view of approximately 60 feet. This unit is capable of speeds up to 100 m.p.h. and travelled through the designated area at the time of the sighting.

10. On the 7th FEB 78 Cst. CLARK the investigator observed a similar occurrence, and found it to be the Rail Diesel Car travelling to Calgary with strobes on. The Strobes are to warn traffic at uncontrolled intersections. It is the conclusion of the Investigator that the U.F.O. sighting was actually the Rail Diesel Car described above. And this U.F.O. is found to be unfounded.

11. Robert Daniel COADY was advised of our finding and agreed that it could have been the Rail Car mentioned.

No further Action Taken.

It was between 8:00 PM and 8:30 PM on highway #1 going east approx. 15 miles west of Calgary. I was watching a light in the north west sky and it was flickering, I then saw it change red, blue and white. It was stationary. I watched then what I thought was a star for about 15 minutes and it constantly changed color. Then I noticed in the southwest sky a bright white light that was stationary, then the light got brighter and began to move north, it stopped and moved quickly towards the car, it stopped and then just disappeared. I then saw it reappear and there was a red light and a blue light and it darted away to the north, it then stopped and then very rapidly rose straight up into the sky. I'm sure it wasn't a plane.

Q. How far away from the car you were driving was this bright light?

A. Land distance I would say about 20 miles, straight up, I wouldn't know how far.

Q. How bright was the light, same brightness as

a star; or brighter?

A. It was the brightest and closest light I've ever seen in the sky if it was a star.

Q. Were the lights flashing?

A. Yes.

Q. Where in relation to the white light were the red and blue lights?

A. They were the same distance ~~off~~ apart from me, I was in the middle, the red and blue light were to my right and the white light was to my left.

Will 1978 Be the Year the UFO Mystery Is Solved?

This is the year of the UFO, experts declare.

"We expect 1978 to be the year that mankind takes its biggest step forward in solving the mystery of the UFO," said Dr. E. Leo Sprinkle.

A flood of new, documented evidence of UFOs is expected this year because:

- Starting public interest in the phenomenon — created by the hit movie "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" — will encourage more responsible people to report their UFO experiences.
- A 10-month computerized sky-watch program will be launched this year to track the paths of UFOs.
- A growing change in attitude among scientists will spark a flurry of probing research of UFOs.

Because of new interest in UFOs among the public and scientific community, "skeptical" scientists and professionals who would have been reluctant and embarrassed before to admit UFO encounters will finally step forward and report their experiences," said astronomer Tom Galia.

"The prestige of such people means the go-ahead — including agencies and the scientific community — will have to follow.

"There is no doubt that the wave of new sightings, evidence of tracks and actual encounters will take us further than ever before toward solving the mystery of the UFOs."

Physicist Dr. ... Bartholomew, a UFO researcher and a member of the International Center for UFO Studies, expects

people more courage to report sightings and encounters, said Dr. J. Allen Hynek, technical adviser on the movie and director of the Center for UFO Studies.

"I think attitudes toward UFOs will open up which will allow us to get much more data — and that means more research will be done in 1978."

"This amazing interest in UFOs isn't confined solely to America. A 30-country international, sky-watch program will be organized this year, enabling scientists for the first time to track the paths of UFOs across most of the five worlds."

The program will record computer data systems of private UFO organizations in the U.S., Canada, England, France, Belgium, West Germany, Denmark, Norway, Finland and Sweden, said Bertil Kahlmann, vice chairman of Sweden's Project UFO (UFO Report Data System), adding: "It is marvelous that after all these years of studies, these countries will be able to virtually track UFOs across half the world."

One of the world's largest radio telescopes has already tracked the movements of a UFO, according to Charles Challa-Smith, one of Britain's top aviation historians and now a professor at the Southampton Institute.

"An expert in aerodynamics revealed to me that the radio telescope at Jodrell Bank (in England) had indeed tracked a UFO," said Challa-Smith. "I am certain UFOs exist. One or two encounters, such as Fraser, will come out and of fairly acknowledge UFOs."

These kinds of things don't exist. Edwin Davenport, an astrophysics expert at NASA's Langley Research Center in Virginia, believes that UFOs are caused by extraterrestrial life.

"I think people from other planets and galaxies are attempting to contact us," he said, adding: "The government knows more about UFOs than they are admitting."

And Davenport, who has watched on the U.S. space shuttle, predicted: "In time, this thing is going to break wide open and the world will begin to know. It might happen any month — it might break any day."

Psychics Predict Space Beings Will Communicate With World This Year

"People on earth will be contacted by space beings before the end of 1978, say three of the country's most famous psychics."

"I predict that we will have actual communication in 1978 from planets like Pluto and Saturn" and the man who accurately predicted King Croyley's death. "I believe there have already been attempts by UFOs to communicate with us, but I predict there will be much in 1978 than ever before."

Miss Kniskadee said she believes UFOs have been coming down and observing earth for years. "They're coming down and keeping an eye on us." "I don't think they'll ever help to do anything other than help. They are technological advances that, if they had wanted to, they could've annihilated us long ago."

Miss psychic Mike Dahan says beings from space who've been living on earth for a long time will reveal themselves this year.

"They will have many messages for us," she said. "The ground will be very important to us will be to cure cancer." "It will be the most exciting and startling revelation in the history of mankind."

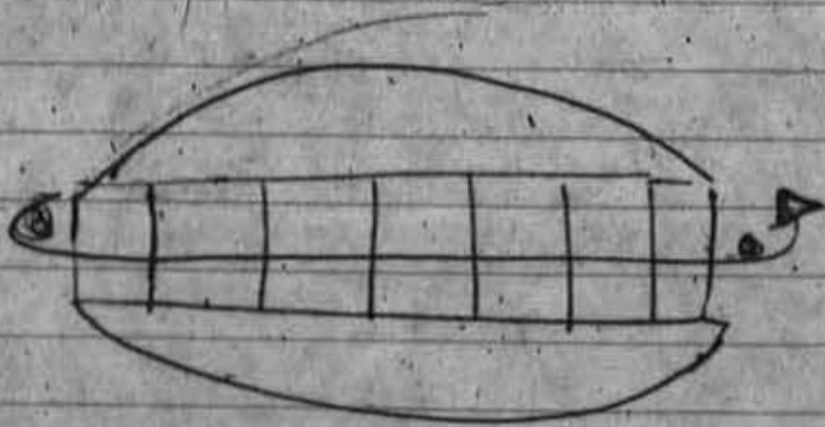

I came in from outside at 4:10 A.M. 5 FEB 78, and I hadn't looked in the sky and I hadn't heard any sound. My mother was in the dining room watching something in the sky. She wasn't using any visual aid of any kind, so we went to get the binoculars to observe the bright light. The binoculars are 7 x 50 376 ft at 1000 yards. Through the binoculars the object was still undistinguishable so I immediately went down stairs to get a telescope. I set it up temporarily on a chair and attempted to catch a fast glimpse of the object before it went too far. It only took a few seconds to get the object in focus and upon doing so I observed a craft. The craft appeared to be two saucer plates with a wafer in between with clearly distinguishable partitions running vertically in the wafer. The predominate flashing red light through the telescope was revolving clockwise around the object. When the revolving light was on the blind side the object appeared to be whitish, yellowish, greenish colour. It was hard to distinguish, it was all these colours at the same time. Observing it for a matter of four to five seconds through the telescope, I wanted to steady myself by steadying myself on a nearby table thereby letting my mother observe the object also. When I put the telescope on the table I couldn't find it again but you could still see it. I would attribute this to being anxious to get it back into viewing. After that I couldn't get it in the telescope so we just observed it with the binoculars but by this time the object was clearly moving to the west getting weaker in it's intensity. After a span of 20 minutes the object was out of view. I don't know why I couldn't get it back in the binoculars. I guess that's about it.

Q: Where in the sky was the object when you saw it ?

A: It was in the western sky and it was moving west.

Q: What were the weather conditions ?

A: Clear, cold and clear. No northern lights that I saw.

Q: Was it moving fast ?

A: No, It didn't appear to.

Q: How long did you observe it for ?

A: A good forty minutes. My mother had been observing it for awhile before me. I really can't be sure of the time, I can only approximate.

At 12:25 a.m., this date, word was received that one Grant Edward LAW (29 APR 54) had reported a UFO sighting to CFB Nameo. The sighting was reported as approximately 2 miles east of Drayton Valley and 1/4 mile south (on Buck Creek road) and also advised that LAW [REDACTED]. A patrol was made to the area a short time later but nothing could be observed; noted to be a clear night with little or no cloud cover. Attempts were made to locate LAW and same came to our office on the 21 FEB 78, and gave the attached statement. LAW stated that he was standing outside his home, which is 1 mile east of the reported sighting location and that he saw a "bright flash" from the southeast and about 1 mile away. He then phoned in the sighting to CFB Nameo and went back outside; however; it was gone. Subject did not investigate nor attempt to contact our office.

It should be noted that in the direction LAW stated he saw the sighting, is located a North Western Utilities Pumping Station with a flare stack and also AMOCO Petroleums of Canada has a large Natural Gas Plant with a flare stack immediately south of the Utilities Station. It is my opinion that the flash observed was an excess amount of gasses flaring at the plant and observed by LAW.

- At 11:00 PM this date, Cst. D.A. McLEOD was contacted by Ernie COMERFORD of Pine Point, N.W.T. Subject stated that his wife, Judith Ann COMERFORD and daughter, Diana Gail COMERFORD (B: 29 SEP 64) and a friend, Elizabeth Ann PARKER (B: 14 SEP 64), all of Pine Point, N.W.T. had been returning from Hay River at approximately 9:30 - 9:45 PM this date and felt they had seen a UFO between approximately mile 10 to mile 34 on NWT highway #5.
 - Writer then spoke with Judy COMERFORD and Diana COMERFORD with regards to this incident. They stated the object had followed them for approximately 30 - 45 minutes. They stated the object was glowing reddish orange in colour and that it seemed to be hovering in the trees at some-times and at other times it would be quite high. Subjects stated that the object was always on one side of them or in front of them, never behind them. The COMERFORDS were advised that writer would attempt to ascertain whether or not any planes or helicopters were in the area at the time.
 - At 11:05 PM writer contacted Aeradio in Hay River and they advised they had no reports of any aircraft in the area between 9:30 PM and 10:45 PM this date. They advised they would have the duty NCO from DND, Yellowknife contact Member with regards to whether or not military aircraft had been in the area.
 - At 11:15 PM Captain D. WATKINS of DND, Yellowknife contacted writer and advised that all Armed Forces planes had been on the ground by 9:00 PM this date. He stated that he had no reports from anything out of the ordinary around Pine Point.
 - At 11:30 PM writer contacted Aeradio from Fort Smith and they also advised there were no aircraft in the area at the time of the sighting.

9. Writer suspects that possibly these persons had seen a colour phase of the moon as it was rising. If in fact it was the moon, it would explain the object always being in front of them and to one side and the fact that it would seem to be hovering in the trees at one time and up in the air at other times. During this patrol, the moon was seen rising at approximately 10:30 - 10:45 PM and appeared quite yellowish. Writer then returned to the COMERFORD residence and asked that Mrs. COMERFORD examine this and advise whether or not there was a possibility this is what she had seen. COMERFORD stated that it was definitely not the moon she had seen. Writer questioned her again to some length about the statements she and the girls had given and she stated that possibly the reason the girls had said that the object 'became the moon' is the fact that they kept trying to convince themselves that it was the moon that they were seeing when they were returning from Hay River. She further stated that the colour of reddish orange is the colour like she had never seen before and that this object is better described as a light than some kind of space ship.

10. No other reports of this nature were received, however, these witnesses whom we feel are quite reliable are sure that they have seen an object that defies explanation.

and I noticed it. When we first saw it appeared

1. At approx. 11:00PM on this date a call was received from Mrs. KENNEY of Wiltondale, Nfld. She advised that her son had seen a large white light in the sky in the Wiltondale area and a large explosion had followed.

2. An immediate patrol was made to the area by Cst. K.W. PAYNE and he spoke to Timothy KENNEY and Daniel CRITCH. Both boys were in Wiltondale and saw the sky light up. CRITCH was seated facing north and only saw the light from the object. KENNEY was looking toward the south-west and noted that the sky lit up and he saw a large object as big as "a volkwagon". It was white and trailing bluish flame. He felt that it was falling straight down and it disappeared behind the hills south of his position. According to KENNEY a large explosion followed about two minutes later. CRITCH states there were, he felt two explosions. The boys were accompanied by a very young child who could offer nothing. Statements were obtained from the boys and are attached.

3. A further call was received stating that two boys from Birchy Head had seen the fireball.

4 FEB 78

4. The two boys at Birchy Head were contacted by Cst. PAYNE and statements were obtained. The statements are attached. One of the boys Randy MOORES (who was accompanied by Larry PARSONS) stated that he was by Pike's Garage in Birchy Head and was looking south when he noticed that the whole sky was light. He noted a fireball trailing blue fire behind it. The other boy saw the same thing.

5. A message containing the above information was forwarded to the National Research Council. I also contacted the local representative of the N.R.C., Prof. R.H. MacNEILL of Wolfville, N.S. and advised him of the foregoing.

6. On the suggestion of Prof. MacNEILL, I contacted the local radio stations with a request that if anyone had any information on or had sighted the fireball they should contact this office. No calls were received.

7. The staff of the Gros Morne National Park at Rocky Harbour were notified and they advised that they had a helicopter doing some wild-life work in that area and would keep this matter in mind as they patrolled.

This information was also passed along to S-Cst. SMITH, Pilot of the R.C.M.P. Helicopter at Corner Brook. He stated that during any trips over this area he would bear the sighting in mind and would advise us if anything was learned.


20 FEB 78

8. I have again contacted the Park People and they advised that their Wild-life patrols have failed to locate any evidence of the fire-ball. A Mr. ANDERSON, Pilot with SEALAND Helicopters stated that he had been doing Mineral Surveys in the area and was aware of the sighting but saw nothing to indicate it had reached the earth. S-Cst. SMITH also had nothing to offer although he had been over the area a number of times since.

INVESTIGATOR'S COMMENTS:

9. From the investigation carried out and from the statements of witnesses, it appears that the fire-ball was travelling in a southerly direction. The witnesses who were East-West from each other state the ball disappeared behind the hills south of them and appeared to be falling straight down. No one could give an exact size but they felt that it may be as big as a car or truck. It lit up the surrounding area. A large explosion followed. A search of the area by helicopter failed to locate any evidence that the fireball had reached earth. This will be kept in mind during the coming spring and if any evidence is located, a further report will be submitted. Members of the R.C.M.P. stationed at Deer Lake and Corner Brook state they noted that the sky lit up about 10:00PM in the area toward Rocky Harbour, but they saw nothing specific. Copies of this report are being directed to Prof. MacNEILL and The N.R.C. in Ottawa. Prof. MacNEILL may note that copies of his form on sightings were forwarded to the witnesses with a request that they be completed and returned direct to him. No further witnesses have been located and nothing of value on the incident has been learned since and we are considering this file as hereunder noted.



The following is factual account of what I saw through my windows (sliding glass door) on Wednesday, February 22, 1978 at seven-forty a.m. (7:40 a.m.) with even the thoughts that entered my head at the time.

The sun was shining and there was not a cloud in the sky.

Was sitting in my chair at the end of the table (you know Shaun where I always sit) I had just turned my radio off about 7:20 - had been listening to station C.B.D. in Fredericton from 5:30 a.m. and decide it was nearly time to turn on T.V. at 8:00 a.m. to watch Canada A.M. program on Ch. 9, when my attention was drawn to bright flickering lights (like huge diamonds) in the sky advancing from the west. (my window faces directly north)

I was spell bound by the lights and remember "telling myself" to take my eyes from the lights and focus on what was ahead of them. I saw a huge, rather sharp-nosed plane, non reflective and steel grey in color. It reminded me somewhat of the pictures of the missiles launched into orbit (excessively long-compared to rear section). My eyes returned to the lights which continued across my line of vision in an easterly direction (this side of St. Pius X Church and in front of the two Hydro power poles - my own points of reference) By this time I was getting only a rear view of the lights and moved to the window to watch them out of sight when all of a sudden it was like a huge brilliant search light had been turned on in the centre and from which a huge streamers of light went in all directions - reaching back almost to the Church. When I first saw this huge oval of light and the ever increasing brilliant rays the thought went through my mind (they are using revolving mirrors - or glass reflectors)!

By this time the light was so intense that I had to close my eyes for fear of being blinded.

There were no other colored lights visible to me at any time just the pure had white.

This "super" structure followed the same path as other planes towards the Saint John Airport.

The entry and passage of this plane was a completely silent one.

Only had the one brief look at the plane (watching the lights plane not visible, as when I was eyeing plane not conscious of being aware of lights)

One other peculiar thing about the "sighting" when I first noticed the bright sparkling lights they seemed quite near and low down but when I shifted my eyes to the plane itself it seemed far away and quite high up. I haven't an iota of relative speed or height but I should imagine it was travelling pretty fast and the whole weird experience only lasted a couple of minutes.

My own conclusions:-

- 1) Definitely a man made plane - launched somewhere on the earth (or outer space) from platform but under complete control by earthlings.
- 2) A reconnaissance plane (hopefully designed in Canada or the United States)
- 3) Under grey skies or at night would probably be invisible
- 4) Still "dying" of curiosity to know the identity of this giant.

1. At approximately 11:05 P.M. this date, a call was received from XJD-82 asking a Member to call the complainant. I was advised by AUSTIN that he had received two complaints around 8:00 P.M. regarding the sighting of Unidentified Flying Objects.

1. Mrs. Mary DANCE of R.R. 2 Douglastown, N.B. was travelling East on Highway 11 around Bartibog Bridge area when she noticed in the sky two balls of fire, which crashed not too far from the road.
2. Mrs. Bernard SAVAGE of Russellville Road, N.B. noticed a similar incident with her husband from their house.

2. An immediate patrol was made to the areas for possible tracks of the object but they couldn't be seen from the road. I patrolled to the Base, contacted Lieutenant AUSTIN and was advised that he was in bed and that someone would contact me in the morning for possible helicopter trip over this area.

03 APR 78

3. After receiving no news from anyone from the Air Force Base, I patrolled over to see the witnesses and took statements from them.

4. Mrs. SAVAGE of Russellville Road stated that the object she saw was about the size of an Airplane cockpit, was on fire and had a tail on it. Apparently the unknown object was seen for approximately a minute and fell not too far away in the woods near a field. Mrs. SAVAGE advised that a Mrs. Vitaline SAVOIE from Russellville Road had seen the U.F.O. as well. Mrs. SAVOIE didn't report same because she thought that people would laugh at her.

5. Mrs. SAVOIE advised that on 26 MAR 78 around 8:00 P.M.

..... AROUND 8:00 P.M. she saw a bright light in the sky which appeared to be like a red light on fire.

6. A statement was also taken from Mrs. Mary DANCE and I was advised by her that while travelling on Highway 11, on 26 MAR 78, with her son, they noticed a ball of fire falling down from the sky. A few seconds after, a second object was seen and appeared to be a little bit bigger. The two objects fell near the road but no light or flames could be seen from the road. Mrs. DANCE waited at the scene for a few moments but no signs of other objects were noticed.



I thought it was a helicopter on fire we stopped the car to listen for sound but heard nothing. - At approx. 2150 hrs., Eddy SMITH of 49750 Castleman Road, Chilliwack, B.C. called this office stating that a large object with lights and two smaller objects are hovering above his house.
- Cst. NITNIKOWSKI was dispatched to the SMITH residence with Cst. D. HARRISON and A/Cst. HALLIDAY arriving soon after.
- Once at the residence, Mr. SMITH came running frantically to the roadway where Cst. NITNIKOWSKI was. He informed that an object with the colors green and red (colors flashing) was seen just west of his home. The object would stand still and then dart side to side and move up and down. Mr. SMITH apparently had been watching this object for approx. two hours. When Mr. SMITH pointed the object out to Cst. NITNIKOWSKI it was in a north west direction and extremely far away. The object did move as it had to be viewed in a different location after approximately fifteen minutes.

7 APR. 78

- At approx. 1600 hrs. Cst. NITNIKOWSKI attended at the SMITH residence where Beverly SMITH (B. 1 JAN. 41) was interviewed.
- Through interviewing her, it was learned that approx. 2030 hrs. she seen an object west of her residence. This object was stationary and had red and green lights. Because of these lights, she felt it was an airplane. Approx. half hour later she noticed the object moving further away in a north west direction. She stated that when the object was first seen it was above three evergreen trees approx. 1/4 mile west of her house. Because it was stationary, she noticed it wasn't an airplane. When the object was still above the three trees, the family went outside. No noise was heard. Only three lights were seen being red, green, orange-yellow. Mrs. SMITH also informed that her neighbour was watching the object with a pair of binoculars.
- Persons who noticed the object at the SMITH residence were:
 - Bonnie SMITH, age 12
 - Nancy SMITH, age 13
 - Bobby SMITH, age 10
 - Cindy SMITH, age 14



8. Being interviewed he stated that approx. 2130 hrs., 6 APR. 78 he noticed an object above the same three trees that Mrs. SMITH had mentioned. When the object was seen by VAN SAANE he noticed the colors red, green, orange and blue changing on the object. He looked through a pair of binoculars, but only seen what he had seen with the naked eye. No 'frame' was seen around these lights. Peter watched this object for approx. half hour noticing the object didn't move. He also heard no noise.

This is the statement of Edward William SMITH (B. 25 SEPT. 27) of 49750 Castleman Road, Rosedale, B.C.

On the evening of April the 6th around the hour of eight thirty, while getting ready for bed my wife, myself noticed the tremendous odor of burning wax throughout the house. When going outside I noticed the same. Just prior to going to bed I looked out my kitchen window noticed two flashing lights red and green passing directly overtop my house travelling in a westerly direction blinking on and off very rapidly. Much faster than a normal airplane. At the time I thought it was an airplane but it suddenly dawned on me that I didn't hear no engine. It continued travelling in a north westerly direction and suddenly made a stop at which my wife and I watched it for an hour and a half prior to calling the police. While it was in a stopped position it had the same appearance as a star. Then it had the same effect as someone using an electric welder which gave off a red, green, orange and varying colors. Now when this occurred the object would either move up or to the right or to the left, for a very short distance. It wouldn't move very far at this particular time. My wife told me it was appearing to move in a north, north west direction. At this time I took a bearing of a tree and over a period of five minutes it had moved a quite a distance, being about thirty-five degrees to the north. Then my boy went outside to the neighbours where I later followed and where we were standing in my neighbours yard watching it flashing. It was at this time I noticed which appeared to be like a shooting star leaving a long white tracer behind it going through the sky right above our house, which we classified as a meteorite. Minutes later we noticed another bright object in the sky travelling very very slow up amongs the stars moving in the same direction. We also noticed three round circles which appeared to be like stars sitting side by side to each other. Now by this time the police arrived. At this time the glowing object had moved quite a distance to the north and was observed by the investigating police officer. After the police officers had left the glowing object disappeared in a northerly direction. At this time the three glowing objects sitting side by side also disappeared as if someone had turned off three lights bulbs. It was a very clear night and no clouds were in the sky. In the area in which the glowing object was there were stars surrounding it or around it, except for the three that sat beside it. Later we had noticed which could've been a helicopter, that was up flying around in the same vicinity. This took place when the objects were no longer noticable in the sky. Which also had a flashing red light, but being a very different bright red and flashing like a light on a airplane. It was travelling much faster, circling in the same area these objects were located.
