Re: U.F.O. Sighting

22:30

On May 21, 1980 at approximately 1530 hrs. about six miles northwest of Carbon, Alberta, Clifford HAZEL of Torrington, Alberta and a friend were driving back to Torrington. In a summerfallow field he saw a ball-like object. It was about four feet in diameter and very shiny, silver like. He described it as a turning ball in a dance hall. The distance that he saw it at was about one street block. The first time he spotted it, it was moving slowly across the field in an easterly direction. It then went out of sight in a coulee. He then saw it hovering over the coulee and then it suddenly went up, at a very fast speed, and disappeared. The full time of observation was about five to six minutes. When the object was hovering, it was approximately thirty to forty feet in the air. On that particular day, it was very warm and the sky was clear.

HAZEL's friend that was with him at the time was Greg HERZOG, also of Torrington, Alberta. We have been unable to contact him to ascertain if he could add anything to HAZEL's description. Mr. HAZEL's observations are probably reliable, however we have not had any other reports of sitings on that date or since then.

At approximately 22:27 hours, 80 MAY 29, Daniel CHAPLIN, age 18 years, of Middle Stewiacke, Colchester County, Nova Scotia, called this office to advise that he had seen a bright object fall from the sky. He observed the object through the window of his home. He had been seated beside the window watching T. V. and had seen the object at approximately 22:15 hours. Sky conditions were clear at the time.

The object was seen when facing east. CHAPLIN first observed the subject at an angle of approximately 60 degrees from the horizon, moving rapidly in a south-easterly direction toward the horizon at a sharp angle. Just before reaching the horizon, the object disappeared behind a tree in front of the window.

CHAPLIN described the object as being approximately one-quarter the size of the moon, bluish white in colour and very bright. He thought it might have flared at one point.

The control tower at Halifax International Airport was contacted. They could report no similar sightings.

Prof. Rupert H. McNEILL, Box 340, Wolfville, N. S., a regional representative of the National Research Council was contacted by telephone. As a result of conversation with Prof. McNEILL, an appeal was made through the local radio station for any information on similar sightings at the time.

Search and Rescue Headquarters, Halifax, was contacted. They advised there were two areas of activity in the Maritimes:

1. A ship was in distress in the Gulf of St. Lawrence. Flares were being dropped from approx. 5000 feet.
2. A military exercise was underway off the eastern shore of Nova Scotia. Shells were being fired to a height of 15,000 feet which contained magnesium flares.

Numerous fireball sightings had been reported to Search and Rescue Headquarters during the late evening of 80 MAY 29. At approximately 23:50 hours, Mrs. William MacDONALD of 43 Phillip St., Truro, N. S. came to this office. He stated he had seen a fireball in the eastern sky. At the time, he was driving his car on the 102 Highway just south of Truro. He was giving the information in response to the radio appeal. WILLIAMS first noticed the object at approximately 30 degrees to the horizon, slightly north of east. The object was headed southeast and downward at a sharp angle. He described the object as bluish green and very bright. He used the word "sparkling". It appeared to go out just before reaching the horizon.


At approximately 2355 hours, Mr. Ron NOLAN, of R.R.#6, Truro, N. S., telephoned this office. He stated that at approximately 22:15 hours, he had been driving on the highway between Sheet Harbour and Upper Musquodoboit, Halifax County, N. S. At a point approximately ten miles south of Upper Musquodoboit, he noticed a bright object in the eastern sky. He first saw the fireball high in the sky. It was headed south on an angle to the horizon. He described it as being bluish green in color with a sparkling tail and extremely bright. NOLAN did not see if the fireball disappeared on the horizon as his view was obstructed by some trees. He first observed the object in a NNE direction. It would appear from talking to NOLAN that he was much handier to the fireball than Mr. MacDONALD.

On 80 MAY 30, I again contacted Prof. McNEILL. He suggested the sightings might not be the result of military activity. The three sightings were made by persons who are believed to be reliable and it should be noted the object was bright enough to attract the attention while driving. It should be noted that no details of the original sighting were released when requesting assistance from the local radio station.

A copy of this report is being forwarded to Prof. McNEILL.

1. Further to telex PSU482 sent to National Research Council, Metecr Centre, Ottawa, a follow-up interview was conducted on this date at the subject's residence of Apt. 1410, 275 Bleecker Street, Toronto, Ontario. Also present were Elizabeth and Camille ALEXANDER; the subject's daughters. In addition to the information provided in the telex, Mrs. ALEXANDER stated that she had called the University of Toronto in an attempt to find out what the objects that she had seen were. She was told that the objects were planets and a star.

2. At the time of the interview, the subject surrendered the undeveloped film of the pictures of the objects seen on 80-05-08. The pictures were of poor quality and could not be developed as a result.

3. This date, Dr. TURNER of the Dunlap Observatory, University of Toronto was contacted. He confirmed that they had received a number of calls similar to Mrs. ALEXANDER. Dr. TURNER identified the objects seen as the planets Jupiter and Mars and the star Regulus, further stating that these three objects were often in the configuration described by the subject.

4. Mrs. ALEXANDER was contacted by telephone this date and was advised of the results of our investigation. She was further advised that her developed pictures and negatives would be returned to her by mail.

5. This date the subject's pictures and negative were returned to her by registered mail. No further action required.

1. Further to Telex GKB 474 sent to National Research Council, Meteor Centre, Ottawa, a follow-up interview was conducted on this date at the subject's residence of 344 Betty Anne Drive, Willowdale, Ontario. Also present were Howard and Rhonda COHENS, the subject's son and daughter. Each of the subjects were interviewed, both separately and together, and they confirmed the original information from the telex. At the time of the interview, it was noted that a number of airline passenger jet aircraft passed over the subject's residence; when asked about the frequency of aircraft passing overhead, they confirmed that their house is situated in an area of approach to Toronto International Airport. They further stated that the sighting was farther north than the normal flight path and the size of the object was larger than any aircraft that has flown over their home before.

2. Rhonda COHENS was the first to sight the object and the only witness to see its bullet-shape. Almost immediately after she first viewed the object, it rotated on its vertical axis approximately 90 degrees and took on a circular shape. She then brought the object to the attention of her father and brother, who as a result, only saw the object as a circular shape.

3. Howard COHENS did take one photograph of the object. When interviewed, he stated that the aperture on the camera remained open approximately 8 to 10 seconds. As a result, the photograph was a time-exposure of the object. When developed, the negative showed a streak of light and was of no value to the investigation.

4. This date, Dr. TURNER of the Dunlop Observatory, University of Toronto, was contacted but he could not assist our investigation.

5. Attended at C.F.B. Toronto and was advised that there was no air traffic out of the base on the night of the sighting.

6. Contacted Mr. OWEN, Tower Supervisor at Toronto International Airport, who advised that he could find no indication in their logs of flights in the area of the sighting. He did, however, state that aircraft from C.F.B. Borden were dropping flares during night exercises which were held on dates around the time of the sighting.

7. Captain COOK of C.F.B. Borden was contacted and he confirmed the use of flares during night exercises. After consulting his records, however, he stated that there were no night exercises on the night in question.

8. Captain MAZEY of Base Operations, C.F.B. Trenton, was contacted and he stated that there were no flights out of the base that night.

9. Further checks with air traffic controllers at Toronto International Airport and Buttonville Airport revealed no further information.

10. The negatives of the film developed was sent by registered mail to the subject. No further action is contemplated at this time.

INVESTIGATOR'S COMMENTS:

11. Both this investigator and Cst. CRANE, who was present at the interview of the subjects, were impressed by the cooperation of the witnesses. There was no evidence of fabrication on their part.

The reliability of HIGGINS is not known as well. The difference in color may be due to the type of lighting present on the glass in the small guard shack being of a tinted nature.

Mrs. COLLIER went on to say that she viewed the same scene the next evening, 80-08-03, on the southeastern horizon.
9. The Climatology Department at Toronto International Airport was contacted by this office to ascertain weather conditions on 80-08-02. Information received was as follows:




INVESTIGATOR'S COMMENTS:

2. During the course of the interview with Mrs. Linda COLLIER, she stated she had seen U.F.O.'s on previous occasions, describing them in detail. One such occurrence dated back five years ago. Mrs. COLLIER described seeing a large circular ship with bright lights that flew low to ground over Highway 400 North of Toronto. When asked whether she ever partook of alcohol or relied on medication in anyway, she stated she did not drink and nor did she require any sort of medication other than the occasional aspirin.

3. Mrs. COLLIER appeared rational and concerned with what she had seen, and that she had not received, in her opinion, a proper explanation.

Dear Sir:

At approx. 0150 Pacific daylight time, the Fort Nelson R.C.M.P. detachment received a phone call from a man identifying himself as a Mr. Edward MOORE. The complainant stated that he had just observed an Unidentified Flying Object at Mile 235 of the Alaska Highway.

Attendance was made to the Tompkins Esso station by Cst. T. WILD and the writer, Cst. D. MEIKLE.

The complainant, Edwin Lee MOORE (DOB 03MAR59), and his wife, Denice Kay MOORE (DOB 31JUL60) were observed to be very scared and very pale, to indicate that they were very scared.

The married couple were immediately separated, and statements were obtained, as per attached photostat copies. The two literally said the same things, but it was also shown that it was not rehearsed.

The sighting occurred at Mile 235 of the Alaska Highway, where the surrounding area is combined of rolling hills and muskeg. The area's only population is at Prophet River, Mile 233 of the said highway, which is approx. 100 people.

The condition of the sky at that time was scattered clouds, with a lot of northern lights during the night. In some lower areas, patches of fog were observed.

The MOORES stated that they were travelling south on the highway and observed a vehicle approaching them, who in turn passed them, but immediately thereafter, two (2) large

lights appeared after the car had passed them. These lights were described as 5 feet tall and 2-3 feet wide and the brightest kind of light that they had ever seen. MOORE stated that these lights were approx. 50 feet off the ground, and slowed to a stop, rotated and stopped. The couple who were driving a 1980 GMC 4x4, also stopped, and tried to ascertain what it was. There was no sound, nor could they observe any type of object behind the lights. The MOORES then proceeded to back up and turn around. The object followed them for approx. seven (7) miles, around corners, up and down hills, with the object following them. The said object flew in the air at again 50-75 feet and also negotiated corners. Mr. MOORE kept the object in sight trying to ascertain what it was, and after approx. seven (7) miles the object then suddenly disappeared as it appeared.

The writer and the MOORES attended at the scene of the sighting, which was approx. 70 miles from Fort Nelson, where it was observed by the writer that there were similar tire tread marks at the area in which they described prior to our attendance. The tread marks indicated that someone slowed to a stop at the curb and proceeded to back up, then turn around, and then left the scene in a hurry.


The investigator should also note that Mr. MOORE had not slept for approx. 36 hours, but his wife had slept on and off in the truck, but was rested before seeing the U.F.O.

I am presently investigating a report of
a UFO that was sighted earlier on this
evening. Could you please relate to me
your knowledge of this incident?

On 20/08/21 at approximately 0130 hrs, my
wife Denise and I were travelling south on
the Alaska Hwy. Denise was picking up
one of the puppies. There was a vehicle
coming towards us. My truck is quite
loaded and the low beams are quite high.
The vehicle flashed his lights at us. When
I looked at the approaching vehicle I saw
another two lights up above the vehicle
and back a little. The approaching car
passed and I could still see the other
two lights. I thought it was another
vehicle up on a hill. As we approached
I told Denise to look at it. As we
got closer the object was about 50 feet
above the ground and about 50 yards
ahead of us. I continued to watch it
and I stopped the truck. This object
turned more directly towards us and
started to come towards us. I opened
the window and listened but I couldn't
hear anything. It still came towards us
so I started to back up and turned
around. As I was turning around the
object stopped in mid air as if watching
(M)

us. I then proceeded to head back towards Fort Nelson. As I was turning around I looked out the window and it looked as if it was following us again. We then proceeded to head back to Fort Nelson. I looked out into the rear view mirror and could see it. I then asked Denise to take the wheel and I stuck my head out the window but then there was nothing there. We were scared so we continued back to Tompkins Esc. on M 293 Alaska Highway at a high rate of speed. We then called the Fort Nelson RCMP.

Q. Do you mind if I ask you a few questions?
A. Yes.

Q. What did these two lights look like?
A. They were rectangular shaped and very bright. They had lines around the sides.

Q. How many hours have you gone without sleep?
A. 30 hours.

Q. Where did you come from today?
A. Watson Lake.

Q. This object couldn't possibly be a helicopter or an airplane?
A. No - there was no sound.

Q. These windows - how big were they?
A. They started out real small but as they came towards us they got as big as about 5 ft tall and about 3 or 4 feet wide.

Q. You didn't see any other vehicles coming from the south?

A. No.

Q. What was about the maximum total time you saw this object?

A. About 15-20 minutes.

Q. Have you had anything to drink today - meaning alcohol?

A. None. - I haven't had a beer or anything for about 2 weeks.

Q. Have you taken any type of drugs today?

A. No.

Q. You said something about the color of the plants on the side of the road. Could you explain that again?

A. As we were headed south they seemed to have a kind of glow to them. But on the way back we noticed that they seemed normal.

A: They started coming toward us slowly, by rolls down the runway, and I started for cover, but there wasn't any, he started looking up and maybe for a half a mile, and the thing came toward us fast, and then we stayed off around in the middle of the road, and started to come back to the tower, and we met those two men, and told them not to go out.

Q: These two men, how did you meet them?

A: They were going south, as we were trying to get away from it all, we stopped them by flashing our lights, and they what, stopped, and they talked us back.

Q: How long have you and your husband been traveling to day?

A: Last night, and all day, we left on Monday night, about quarter to eleven, and I've been up all last night, all day long.

Q: How would sleep have the two of you had in the last 48 hours?


A: I've been quite busy, playing on or off in the truck, but haven't had any.

Q. What did you have first?

A. Breakfast, Alaska.

Q. How long did this light follow you?

A. In my opinion, approx. 7 to 10 minutes, it might be that it was a short time, but we were moving.



1. On the above date at 2230 Hrs. Mr. Edwin THOMAS reported seeing an object coming out of the sky and down to earth. He stated it was bright blue/green at the top and yellow/white at the bottom. There was no flame trailing and it didn't light up the sky. It came down on the opposite side of Butler Lake from where he lived. This would be on the Hampton side of Butler Lake.
2. A short time later a call was received from Mrs. Ken MATHESON of 1 North Street, Rothesay, N.B. She related that she saw an object of the same description land to the south side of the McKay Highway. This was between that highway and the Saint John airport.
3. I checked with the Air Traffic Controller at the Saint John airport. He got two similar reports. The only name he could remember was Glen MORGAN of Churchland Road. I wasn't able to locate such a person.
4. Also on our Police Radio I heard Campobello Detachment discussing a similar sighting. I checked with Fredericton Telecommunications Centre and they said similar sightings were reported in Sackville and Moncton.
5. I checked with Cpl. John MOORE of C.F.B. Gaagetown Military Police. He informed me the firing at their range ceased at 2213 hours and could not cover such a geographical area.
6. I telephoned Moncton Telecommunications Centre and they advised they received a report from Sackville Detachment and an EPA Pilot via the Air Traffic Controller at Moncton. All reported sighting occurred about the same time.
7. I checked with C.F.B. Chatham with Sgt. RICHARDS. He informed me they heard via C.F.B. St. Margaret's that a similar sighting was reported by the Rogersville Fire Department.
8. Radiogram # 80/39 submitted.

9. This date I patrolled to Fairvale and interviewed Mary (Mrs. Kenneth) MATHESON. A statement was obtained and a copy attached. She seems a reliable person and from the location she described I do not feel it is the same object Mr. THOMAS saw.
10. This date I interviewed Mr. Edwin THOMAS and took a statement, copy of which is attached. Mr. THOMAS seems to be a credible person.
11. There doesn't appear to be any further action which can be taken at this point. Unless instructed to the contrary the file will be closed. Copy of report sent direct to National Research Council, Planetary Sciences Section, 100 Sussex Drive, Ottawa, Ontario K1A 0R6.

1. 80.10.03, 2120 hours, captionally-noted attended at office with his mother, Mrs. Anne GALLIFORD. The sighting occurred in an alley off Alward St. near 15th Ave., Prince George, B. C. The time of the sighting was approximately 2040 hours, under clear skies, after sundown. The temperature was around 17° C. according to the radio station (C.J.C.I.).

2. According to the captionally-noted, the entire sighting lasted only 5 to 7 seconds. The object appeared to be approximately 10' x 12' by 5' in size (see attached diagram for shape). The object had a steady glow, bright red in colour. The captionally-noted was quite emphatic in pointing out that it did NOT pulsate. A soft humming sound was emitted from the object, not loud enough to be heard other than within close proximity. The object travelled from west to east and stopped approximately 25 feet above the ground about 50 feet from the captionally-noted. It then hovered for about three of four seconds and took off easterly and disappeared up out of sight within two seconds. During the hovering, the object appeared to circle the ground just above a tree. The captionally-noted used the tree as a reference to gauge height and size of the object.

3. Taking the age of the captionally-noted into account, it was decided to interview the boy's mother as well. According to her, the boy has never been one to tell stories. He is an intelligent, mature boy for his age, and he seems to know a fair bit about aircraft as he wishes to join the Air Force when he is older. The mother states that when her son came home, he was white in the face a really trembling. As the boy ran into the house, he was in such a rush that he slammed the front door so hard that he smashed the light on the outside of the house. At that time the boy was just terrified according to the mother. She could not get him to go back outside for fear that it might still be out there. She had to coax him to come to the Police Office.

4. During the sighting the boy could feel warmth, on his face and hands, these being the only exposed areas of skin due to the clothing he was wearing. There was no flame or smoke being emitted as there should be if there was any exhaust. It should be noted that the feeling is that the boy probably did see something, but exactly what is unknown.




5. C.F.S. Baldy Hughes was contacted at 2300 hours, and the sighting was reported to M/Cpl. SCHNEIDER.

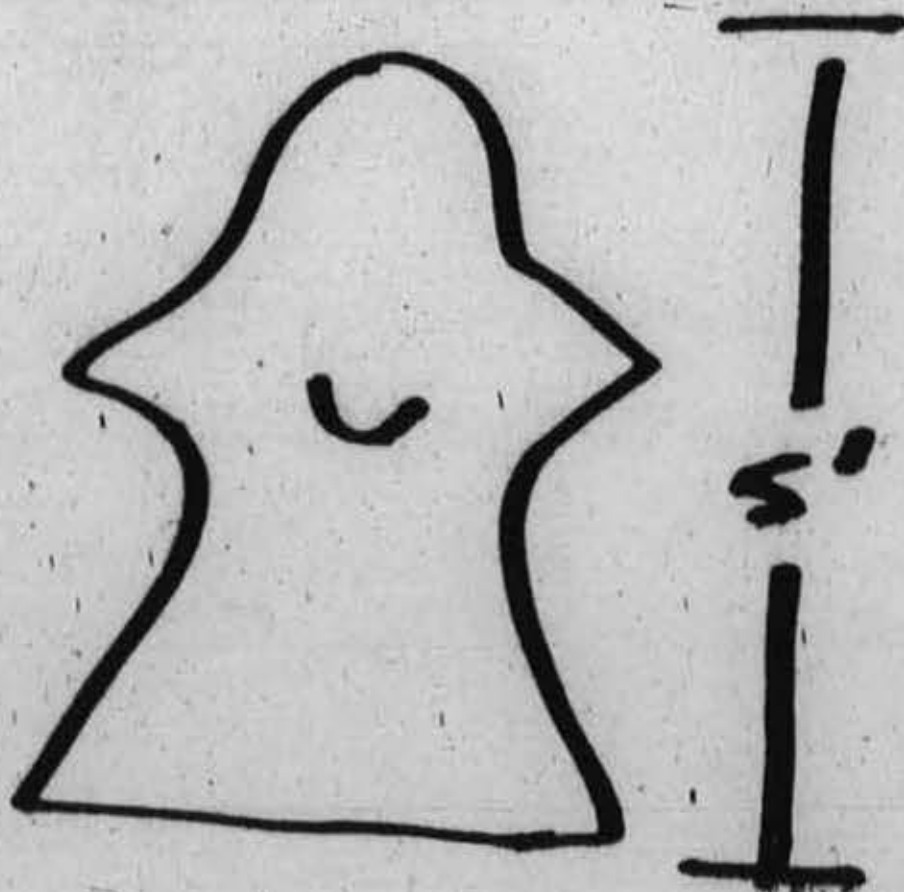

1. The following is submitted in accordance with Op. Man. IV. 2.1.G.1.B.2. and in reference of CPIC message of 18 OCT 80 20:59/45.

2. At 1829 hrs this date the writer was contacted by Ed KREUTZ, 318 Argyle St, Regina, Sask., Phone 543-0961. KREUTZ was enquiring as to who he should report the sighting of a UFO. Further information gathered revealed that early AM this date approximately 5:45 hrs he was driving east on 48 Hwy near Davin, Sask. At the time his brother Andy KREUTZ Age 20 was also with him. At approximately 4 miles east of Davin, Sask., they both noticed an object slightly north of Highway 48. At the time the object in question appeared to be at a height about one thousand feet. As they kept driving towards this object described as circular in shape and with flat bottom, same observed losing height stopped and appeared to become stationary approximately 200 - 300 feet. Ed KREUTZ estimated that diameter of object at that height was around 25 feet. Ed KREUTZ and his brother kept driving and at one time the object was observed directly above their vehicle. Ed KREUTZ further stated there was no sound or static on their radio and that their vehicle kept functioning in a normal manner as they went along. Time of observation was around 15 minutes upon which the object took a southbound direction. Weather conditions at the time was clear, visibility was good and temperature cold.

3. Enquiries made in the Regina Detachment Complaint Book showed no report of any such happenings. Regina Telecommunication Centre contacted and advised that they had not received any calls of this nature. Lastly I contacted the Regina Air Traffic Controller who advised they did not have any report of UFO on their log. Enquiries are continuing in this matter and Ed KREUTZ and his brother will be met at a later date and statements obtained. Telex was also sent to the National Research Council in Ottawa via Regina Telecoms.

4. I contacted Ed KREUTZ (B: 62 Jul 11) at his residence at 318 Argyle St N, Regina, Sask. Ed KREUTZ interviewed by writer and statement obtained and is included in this file for perusal. The original report made to Regina Detachment day before was basically confirmed and the interview first started by having Ed KREUTZ sketch what he saw that morning. This drawing is also included to report being forwarded to the National Research Council. The drawing is also divided into two parts which first shows what they first saw initially and bottom part what each saw when they got closer.

5. Further to the original description of the object given to the writer Ed KREUTZ reported that the object had blue lights on the left side and red lights on the right side. There was also mention a search light that was activated once their vehicle passed by the object. Edward isn't sure however, if the beam had hit the car. Edward lost sight of the object for a short time however, the next time the object was seen it had gone across the road to the south side. Although they didn't stop at all during the incident on account of being quite scared, Ed feels that the object was stationary at the time. Mention was also made to Edward about his AM radio being turned on, which it was, and Ed advised there was no static or interference on the radio and that furthermore vehicle did not experience mechanical failure of any sort.

6. Ed further stated that a McGavin's truck was following them a short way behind approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ mile. He explained that they had passed this vehicle earlier and Edward is quite certain that the search light came on between the two vehicles. Therefore, an attempt is to be made to locate the McGavin's truck driver at a later time and obtain statement from same. Edward also stated that the whole sighting lasted about 15 minutes.

7. In talking with Edward my impressions were that he was still scared or impressed with this incident. He also told me he was quite skeptical about these phenomenons and that of this date was a believer. He appeared to be a serious kid clean cut and mature for his age and undoubtedly previously mentioned was quite scared about the incident.

8. Local indices check made on subject to the Regina City Police and Criminal Records file - all indices checked were negative.

9. Andy KREUTZ was unavailable for interview at the time and therefore a patrol was made to the Flight Service Station at the Regina Airport. Flight Service Station is the only office open at Regina Airport between 1200 midnight 0700 hrs local time. The Station Manager made available to the writer all the flight plans for 80 Oct 18. All examined by writer with negative results as to any aircraft in the Regina area being in the Davin District at that particular time. These flight plans include military flights however, none appear to be around at that particular location at that time. It should also be noted that the Terminal Area Centre and their radar services are not open between 12 midnight and 0700 hrs in the morning, and their services are being monitored by Winnipeg Centre. It also should be noted that there is no radar coverage assumed by Winnipeg Centre over Regina and that their range goes only as far as Brandon, Man.

10. Although the Regina Centre and Radar were closed at the time, a check was nonetheless made with the Supervisor of Air Traffic Control in Regina, Sask. It is believed an occurrence of this nature would have been reported to this services, however,

HOWEVER, enquiries made with the supervisor on shift revealed no report of the sort. A check was also made with the supervisor with the Terminal Centre immediately south of Regina Centre to wit: Salt Lake City and the supervisor at this location advised that there was no report of an occurrence of this nature. Reason of the check was that object was last seen heading south at the time.

11. In the later part of the day I was able to meet Andy KREUTZ (B: 20 Oct 60) 318 Argyle St N, Regina, Sask. Statement was obtained as well from Andy and is included with file for perusal. Again Andy basically corroborated the statement made by Edward and being the driver of the vehicle at the time was able to give a better drawing than his brother. The drawing is also included with Andy's statement and will be forwarded to the National Research Council as well. The drawing in question is definitely of a circular object. Andy also stated that the object was approximately 300 feet high and that he had quite a good sight on the object and that the weather conditions were excellent. Andy also gave the same description of the object being blue light left red light on the right and a red flashing light in the centre. Andy was also able to see that when the red flashing light in the centre was turned off a search light came off it from exactly the same location. The light source was protruding from the bottom may be a foot and was also a foot in diameter. Andy mentioned also that AM radio of their vehicle had no static interference and that the engine was working normally. There was no noise heard from the object. Andy confirmed as well the part of overpassing McGavin's truck and saw the light beam of the object between the vehicles. Andy feels that whoever was driving that truck would have seen the object. Andy described the object going across the highway as being of quite a fast move. Dead start to dead stop, not in a jump as such but without acceleration. Total time of sight was estimated as 15 minutes and Andy also added that the blue light on the left side appeared to be beeping out of the object and was rather pale in comparison to the red light on the other side. It may be also mentioned that the search light did not hit their car but was going up and down the highway.

12. Local indices check was made on the subject as well to the Regina City Police and record indicates that subject has no criminal record.

13. A check was also made with Cst. LEFEBVRE of Montmartre Detachment, which detachment is in charge of covering the area of Vibank, Sask. Cst. LEFEBVRE advises no report of UFO's from their point. It also appears that McGAVIN's Company has a regular run going through Vibank and Montmartre and Cst. LEFEBVRE made some attempts to locate the driver of this vehicle however, subsequent check revealed negative results and an attempt is to be made by the writer to contact him in Regina for further information.

14. This date the writer contacted the McGavin's Company, Albert St, Regina, Sask., 543-9655 and talked to the Fleet Manager, Mr. CRADDOCK. Information gathered revealed that Gordon MacKENZIE of 867 Morris Cres, Regina, Sask., Phone 949-6182 was working at the time and would be the driver which was making the run on No. #48 Hwy. Mr. MacKENZIE was contacted by the writer and an interview was made on 80 Oct 22 at his residence in Regina, Sask. A statement was obtained from Mr. MacKENZIE and is included in this file for reference. Unfortunately MacKENZIE mentions not seeing anything unusual on his run and when further advised that the enquiry was about an unidentified flying object, he advised that again that he had not seen anything. My conversation with Mr. MacKENZIE revealed that he was a believer in UFO and I feel that should he have seen an object of this nature on No. 48 Hwy he would have mentioned same to the writer. All the three witnesses regarding this matter have been contacted and written statements obtained from same. All avenues have been explored by this detachment and this report is now being forwarded to Ottawa c/o National Research Council for their information, and whatever action deemed appropriate. This matter is now concluded to this point.

Statement of Andy KREUTZ (B: 20 OCT 60)- 318 Argyle
Street N, Regina, Sask

Saturday morning 80 Oct 18 at around 5:40 A.M. I was with my brother Ed and I was driving my car eastbound near Davin, Sask. We were east of Davin around 2 miles. At the time in the distance about 2 miles to the east and just off the highway to the north, I noticed what appeared to be a TV Tower or an aeroplane. It was a red flashing from the time we seen it. We kept approaching and I ruled out the possibility of an aircraft as I was catching up to it. Then we got just about right beside it and I noticed the lights the blue one on the left and red on the right area the red one in the middle was still flashing. It was off to my left 200 ft about and at most 200 - 300 ft in the air. Then when we had just come beside it and a little bit back the object sort of kept up with us and the red flashing light in the middle stopped flashing and the white search light came on from the exact same spot. I was seeing the object from the bottom side in an angle. The object was circular in shape 25 - 30 feet in diameter in the area where the light from was protruding may be a foot and was around a foot to 18" in diameter. When this search light came on, it traced behind my vehicle then to the left on the highway up and down. It didn't stop at all on any particular object, no noise from the object was heard. The AM radio was on and seemed to be working all right. There was a vehicle that we had previously passed, it was a McGavin's truck 2 - 3 tonnes. He stopped in Vibank later on. He didn't stop for that object, seemed to stop but kept up with us later on. When the search light was on it was between the 2 vehicles. The object kept beside us, just off to the left for about 1/8 of a mile, after that it switched off the search light turned on the red flashing and crossed over to the south side of the highway. It took it about 3 seconds to go across the highway. He wasn't a real jump, but it wasn't gradual either. It was a steady move. After that I could no longer see it as it was in the blind spot of the car. Weather conditions was clear at the time, cold and no wind. It was still dark. The object was standing out in the dark from the moon. There was no markings as such but the blue light seemed to be beeking us by contrast to the other side light and was not as bright as the other light almost pale. Search light didn't hit the car at any time. Duration of the sight from when we first saw it was about 15 minutes. After we got passed Vibank traffic got a big heavier. Straight ahead to the east exactly was a star very bright exactly over the road. Thats about it.

On Saturday morning at around 5:45 A.M. I was with my brother Andy KREUTZ in his car driving eastbound on #48 Hwy about 4 miles out of Davin, around midway to Vibank, Sask.

Andy was driving at the time and at first I noticed it and jokingly I said look at the UFO and as we approached it we had thought it was an aeroplane, but we kept getting closer and closer to it. Andy asked me if there was a TV Tower there and I told him that there wasn't. Once we got about 300 feet away, we noticed the two other lights on the side blue on the left, red on the right with the red flashing light in the centre. Once we had appeared to cross its path, the search light came on. I saw the light come on but I am not sure if it hit the car. Around that time I lost it because of the visibility of the window. Then I noticed it after it passed along the car through the back window. At that time it was definitely on the other side of the road the south side. When I noticed it it appeared to be stationary. We never stopped the vehicle we were too scared. From what I saw it was dark, it was hard to say because of the flashing light. It was a bright red and a constant light flashing. The two on the side were constant on and the middle one flashing. Weather conditions were clear, cool and dark. Could see the stars still. Shape of the object was round, with oval top. The lights seemed to be on an arc pattern so I presume it was round.

We had the radio on at the time there was no static interference and the car engine kept functioning without problem. As we crossed the path of this object, I would estimate it was 200 - 300 ft off the road on the north side and 200 - 300 ft. high.

There was only one other vehicle around there at the time. A McGavin's truck travelling same direction behind us about 1/4 to 1/2 mile. We had passed it earlier. We lost the truck around Vibank, so I think he might have turned into Vibank, Sask. Nobody else that I noticed neither Andy or I had been drinking. I don't drink. The whole incident was frightening and scarey. I didn't report right away. Didn't know what to do, went home and talked to Mom, and Dad and said we should talk to you. I was skeptical before but now I do believe.

1. On the 21st of October, 1980 Mr. Bob WALKER contacted the Terrace Telecom Centre at approx. 2145 hrs. advising that he and his wife plus another witness had just seen a UFO and wished to speak to a member.
2. On this same date, the 21st of October, at approx. 2147 hrs. I attended at the complainant's residence at 3667 First Ave. where I met with Mr. & Mrs. WALKER at the rear door to their house.
3. The complainant advised me that he had ordered a taxi to attend his residence to pick him up to take him to a class that he was teaching at a local school. Mr. WALKER advised me that Rita DAVID, the taxi driver, came around to his house to pick him up and upon getting into the car with her Mrs. DAVID directed Mr. WALKER's attention to a bright light which was hovering or flying over the ridge area directly to the south of town. This ridge is a ridge that is presently under construction of the new ski lift for the ski hill area. Mr. WALKER said that when he got into the car and she pointed it out to him, he noticed that the light was a circular shape and a stronger light than what is normally seen as a street light or even a star or a satellite. He advised that the bright light was moving in a very erratic pattern over the ridge and along the ridge towards Hudson Bay Mountain. He further stated that he and Rita watched the object for approx. 5 minutes or so before he got out of the car and went back into the house to inform his wife of the sighting. He then said that he went back out and the light object had gone down in behind the ridge closest to the mountain and when it had, he told his wife Diane to watch the area as she might see it. Mr. WALKER then informed me that he departed in the taxi to the school without seeing the object again.
4. Diane WALKER advised me that she watched for this object that her husband had seen and approx. 2 minutes later it appeared again at about the same location that he had pointed out to her. She informed me that the object was circular in shape with a bright flashing white light and a bright pink glow around the sphere. She further advised that she watched this brightly lit object for approx. 30-45 minutes and during that time it moved back and forth along the mountain and ridge area at a very fast rate of speed. She then stated that the sphere hovered over the mountaintop and moved back and forth in a pattern using the mountaintop as a sort of central point. Mrs. WALKER then informed me that the sphere came in towards town at one point at a very fast rate of speed and then moved back again over the mountaintop. Mrs. WALKER then said that the sphere again came in towards town at a much faster rate of speed and closer in towards town than it did the first time. She then advised that she went into the house to do something and when she checked on the object again it had gone. Diane WALKER informed me that this incident had taken place between the hours of 1930 and 2030 on this date.

5. I then asked Mr. WALKER why he failed to report this incident at the time it was happening. He advised me that he didn't report it because he felt that no one would believe either him or Rita DAVID. He stated that he observed this object at approx. 1930 hrs. and also described it as a sphere with a pinkish glow around it.

6. On attendance at the complainant's residence and meeting with both persons, I felt that the complainant's wife was rather excited about the incident and about sighting this object that she had seen. He appeared to me to be very calm and very collected about the whole incident. Both persons appeared to me to be sober and none had any odour of alcohol on their breath whatsoever.

7. Description of Sightings:

Shape: Circular when stationary, inverted dishlike shape when moving.

Colour: Bright white light on the lower half of the sphere when stationary. Sphere also had a bright pink glow around it and seemed to light up the mountain area with this pinkish glow due to a light snow covering on the mountain.

Altitude: Approx. 5 -6500 feet.

Movement: Rapid, traversing type of movement, faster than a plane or helicopter.

Number of Objects: One.

8. From the point that the complainant and his wife had made the sighting, I could see clearly the entire mountain area and also the trees along the ridge above town. The sky was very clear with the moon casting a light down on the snow of the ridge and also the mountain area. The air was cool, to the point that frost was forming on the cars. None of the street lights in the area of the complainant's house obstruct the view of the mountain.

9. I then made my attendance to the Rita DAVID residence on King Street and Third Ave. where I had intended to speak with Rita herself. She was, however, not home and I was therefore given a phone number to call at which I could speak to her. This number was called and I spoke to Rita. She confirmed the sighting of a brightly lit object and also that she had made the first sighting of it. When Mr. WALKER came out to the car she informed him of this sighting also and directed his attention to it where they both watched it for approx. 5 minutes. When speaking with Mrs. DAVID on the phone, she sounded to me at that time to be sober and completely believable.

10. At approx. 2250 hrs. on this same date, the 21st of October, I attended to the Smithers Airport where I spoke to the terminal dispatcher, Bruce BOBICK, who was the controller for the airport that evening. He advised that the last plane out of the area and around the Smithers area was just prior to 1900 hrs. He further advised me that they did not have any radar type of tracking or monitoring device with which they could observe incoming and outgoing planes. Mr. BOBICK also advised me at that time that the nearest tracking facility was near COMOX or Prince George at the Armed Forces Bases.

11. I then returned to the Detachment where I called down to Comox to the Comox Armed Forces Base at 339-2211 and spoke to a female person down there. This person then put my line over to another line on the Base which handles such calls as this sighting. The female person at this part of the Base took down some of the details of the sighting, she did not, however, advise whether anybody would be getting in touch with this office as to confirming any sort of sighting.

12. A complete CPIC message has been forwarded to Prince Rupert Sub/Div and also to the CO "E" Div., Dist. 2 advising of the sighting and of some of the details of the complaint.

13. It is my finding in this matter that the complainant's are both believable, but it is not known for sure what exactly they had seen on this particular date. On the ridge area where the complainant's had seen this flying type of object, there is a new development of some sort going up there in which the ski hill is putting up a ski lift to the other side of the ridge. There is a road up there, but there are trees along this road which would cover the light of any sort of vehicle which might be driving along it. Both complainant's stated that this object was not coming from within the tree area or on the mountain itself, but flying above the ridge and also the three peaks of the Hudson Bay Mountain. On Hudson Bay Mountain itself there are four peaks, three of which are much higher than the fourth. Mrs. WALKER had advised me at the time that this object was flying above the mountaintop above the highest peak of the three of the four peaks. She stated also that it seemed to use the top of the mountain as a central point at which it would traverse out and then back in, out again in the opposite direction and back to the central point, then out again and continued like this for a period of 30-45 minutes. Both Mr. & Mrs. WALKER and also Rita DAVID stated that this object was a brightly lit type of sphere or dishlike object which was moving very rapidly, faster than a normal plane would travel. Findings at the airport have stated that no helicopters or planes were flying in the general vicinity at the time this sighting was made.

14. As there is nothing further that can be done on this particular complaint, no further action will be taken until such time as correspondence is received to re-open the file.



"I was walking my caterpillar tractor back from Elnora to Secondary Road 590, it was around 6:15 p.m., something caught the corner of me eye, it looked like it was a meteor when I first saw it. It had a long streaking tail on it. As it came closer I saw it was not a meteor because of the individual lights on it. As it came closer it slowed down and I could see that the colour of the lights, it had four amber lights on the side. It had a square light around 20 by 30 feet on the back side of the round shaped object. It sort of turned on its side so that I could see the shape of the object. It was round shaped, like a dish, 30 to 40 feet thick. It was 200 to 300 yards long and wide. It was perfectly circular. As it slowly started moving away I pulled my caterpillar tractor up a bit so I could get a better look at it before it went over the trees. It speeded up real quick and kind of left a trail behind it. I watched it as it was going west until I could not see it anymore. I'm not sure what the color of the object was as the lights were very shiny. They were definitely artificial lights."

The duration of the sighting would be approximately two seconds and none of the witnesses heard any sound from the object. They were all in agreement that the object appeared as if it was going to collide with the peak of a house approximately 250 feet from their location.
5. Cst. NASON and myself went to the scene of the sighting shortly after accompanied by the four witnesses. The area was thoroughly checked with nothing unusual found and no indications of an impact having occurred. A light covering of new snow made the investigation of the scene most accurate. On the 16th of October, 1980, 100 Mile House detachment received a call from a Wayne Marshall of 9880 Dyke Road in Richmond, B.C. advising us that a friend of his by the name of Ken Sumner, 9300 Walford Road, Richmond, B.C., phone 604-270-2593, had reported to Marshall of a U.F.O. sighting. Sumner was called in Richmond and he gave the following account:

During the week of October 6-10, 1980 Ken Sumner and four other persons were hunting in the vicinity of Gustafson Lake which is approximately 23 miles west of 100 Mile House, B.C. At approximately 6:30 p.m. two of the persons saw an object fly overhead so fast that they could not get an accurate description. Approximately 45 minutes later an object was sighted in the sky. This object was stationery and moved slowly to the left and then to the right. It had a green light on the top with a red light on the bottom side. Approximately one hour later three of the men in the camper noted a light to come through the vent in the top of the camper and move around to the front of the truck. It appeared to be a beamed light and stated that it moved faster than if held by hand. It was alleged that this light came through even where there were no windows. The camper then shook and the men stated they felt like their bodies were rising in the air. At approximately 10:30 a.m. they heard a loud noise something like a jet taking off. He stated that all the men were so scared they did not look out and this was not reported to our office at the time of the incident as they did not feel they would be believed.

As it was stated earlier I contacted Sumner and that was his account. He advised that with him was Randy Balway, Phone 604-278-1961, also Al Slather, age 24, address and phone number unknown and Joe Balaway, address unknown as well as another gentleman.

UFO SIGHTING REPORT
INDIAN BAY - 18 JUN 67

1. Further to my referenced message, forwarded herewith are photographs of the site, marked in red on the enclosed map, which is the alleged site where the UFO hovered.
2. On photo number 1 (vertical) you will note a point which has been annotated by 408 Squadron and is included as the centre point for most of the oblique photographs. Although there appears to be some significance in the photographs, this rock outcropping was examined by S/L Bissky who found nothing out of the ordinary except for a few freshly cut shrubs at the west side, which the Indians admitted cutting, and the tree mentioned in my message is lying towards the rock.
3. On the oblique photo 1 are marked cabins A and B which are unoccupied. The remainder of the cabins in the area are all occupied by Indians of the reserve. Also marked in red square on this photo is the general area from which limb samples were taken for analysis. The round red circle encloses the downed tree.
4. Of interest, the Department of Forestry is having their field representative in the area examine the site this week to determine the cause of wilting of some of the leaves. One set of samples showed evidence of fungus which would cause the wilting but the remaining samples showed no live evidence of fungus or blight.



Dear Allen:

Nice to hear from you. Was a little puzzled by your final paragraph, I quote "I had hoped to see you in Brighton and perhaps I may yet if your plans change." I have already paid for our room at the Brighton Hotel for the IAU, and thought I had said in my last letter to you that Peggy and I would be in Brighton. My plans have not changed, and I will be happy to take this opportunity to discuss the general field of peculiar things seen in the sky.

I am enclosing a copy of the complete report of the incident referred to by Tennyson in his letter to you. I phoned Tennyson to see if he remembered the incident and he told me it was a sighting of January 1968, in the area of Shoal Lake, Manitoba. Fortunately, he gave me the Defence Department's numbering of the case which was No. 71, and hence we had no trouble identifying it in our files. To illustrate the mistakes that can occur, even in letters between scientists, this sighting was actually made on June 18, 1967 at Shoal Lake in Ontario, which is quite a different Shoal Lake to the one in Manitoba. Also, I am afraid I do not agree with our friend Tennyson's statement that it "remains as a fascinating unidentified aerospace phenomenon." I had not gone into this particular sighting in detail before, but the similarity of the report to much other material we get on Venus made me suspicious at once. Hence, I have just done a rough plot of the position of Venus for the time in question at Shoal Lake. Venus was at greatest elongation in the western sky, 6° above the horizon in a direct WNW, and within 40 minutes of setting. The moon was on the observer's left, as stated, while the planet was on his right. It is possible some anomalous refraction might have been present, but the irregular motion of the host plus the well known 'moving point effect' could well account for the whole report of the aerial phenomenon.

There is nothing at all to connect the wilting of the trees or other foliage items with the aerial sighting, and I have not troubled to send you a whole series of oblique air photographs of the district which

were taken by the Air Force, and which show nothing out of the ordinary; no patterns or circular rings or anything of the kind. If I had had anything to do with this sighting I would not have recommended the detailed air-coverage that was given, but this was before we took over the files here. As far as I know, Tennyson picked up this information when searching the Defence Department files, and I don't believe he had had any previous experience in dealing with reports of things seen in the sky.

Just to keep you abreast of some of the reporting that still seems to go on in our newspapers, I enclose a page from a recent issue of the Ottawa Citizen. As you will note, this does not include a report of anything new, but refreshes some sightings which caused excitement in the Chalk River area a year or two ago. The fact that the large Petawawa Military Camp is not far away, and that at Petawawa they frequently make tests of various types of flares and rockets, is not unrelated to some of the excitement in the area. On the other hand, I am by no means suggesting that this necessarily explains everything.

I am impressed by the fact that I have yet to see any clear evidence of a connection between the so-called rings, an example of which is shown in the large picture, and the area phenomena reported from the same district. Once something peculiar has been sighted in the sky people seem to immediately look for evidences of landing, and any peculiar earth marking is connected up with the sighting without any good reason. I had some grass from one of these areas (not the one photographed) analysed by the Geological Survey a short time ago. An X-ray study showed no evidence of radio activity nor of any metallic or mineral content. The strange crystalline substance reported on the grass was entirely biological and must have been the result of some organic action, perhaps a rare type of mold or disease. I did not attempt to follow the matter any further at this point.

I try very hard to keep an open mind in this subject, but I must confess I get more and more disillusioned with what people report they have seen with their eyes. You will, I'm sure, note a very significant point about the newspaper article I am enclosing. When you read the last few paragraphs carefully, you find that at least seven people saw a peculiar light in the morning sky. Six "dismissed it as a bright star or pretended it did not exist." However, the seventh, a young girl, had a very lurid story to tell about the whole event. I might add that at this time, Venus was well visible in the morning sky, and that for quite a few days near the middle of September was positioned with Regulus very close to it. This might explain the description of something coming out from under the bright object.

We have not had any recent reports worth noting here. I will certainly do as you suggest and quietly carry out my own investigation of anything I think worth studying. Looking forward to seeing you in Brighton.







As the public is obviously becoming more conscious of UFOs, and in view of the increasing number of UFO reports being referred to CFHQ for action, it is suggested that the present policy for handling UFO reports be reviewed with the aim of determining a more objective and effective procedure for dealing with these reports.

3. The aim of this memorandum is to review briefly the present procedure for actioning UFO reports referred to CFHQ and to suggest a more effective method for dealing with UFO reports.

CFHQ ACTION ON UFO REPORTS

4. In brief, the Director of Operations' staff endeavours to classify UFO reports into one of two main categories, namely:

- a. Category One - Information which would suggest the type of phenomena associated with fireballs and meteorites, or
- b. Category Two - Information that does not conform to the physical patterns usually associated with fireballs or meteorite activity.

5. Reports which are classified under category one are forwarded to the Director for Scientific Co-ordination for evaluation. In addition, copies of the report are made available to NAC Meteorite Centre and to a named representative of the province in which the sighting was made.

6. Reports which are classified under category two are studied by the Operations Staff who either place the report on the UFO file with an annotation to the effect that further investigation is not warranted, or initiate action to have the report investigated by a military officer. To date, no evidence has been discovered which would suggest a threat to national security. The US authorities reached a similar conclusion i.e. that there is absolutely NO evidence indicating a threat to national security. This being the case, it is suggested that DND should NOT be the agency primarily responsible for the receipt and investigations of UFO reports.

7. It is emphasized that no procedure exists at this time to assess any possible scientific information which might be obtainable from these reports. It should be noted that in the United States a civilian oriented scientific investigation has in fact been instituted on the University of Colorado. In Canada, the National Research Council would appear to be the body most suited to organize such an investigation.



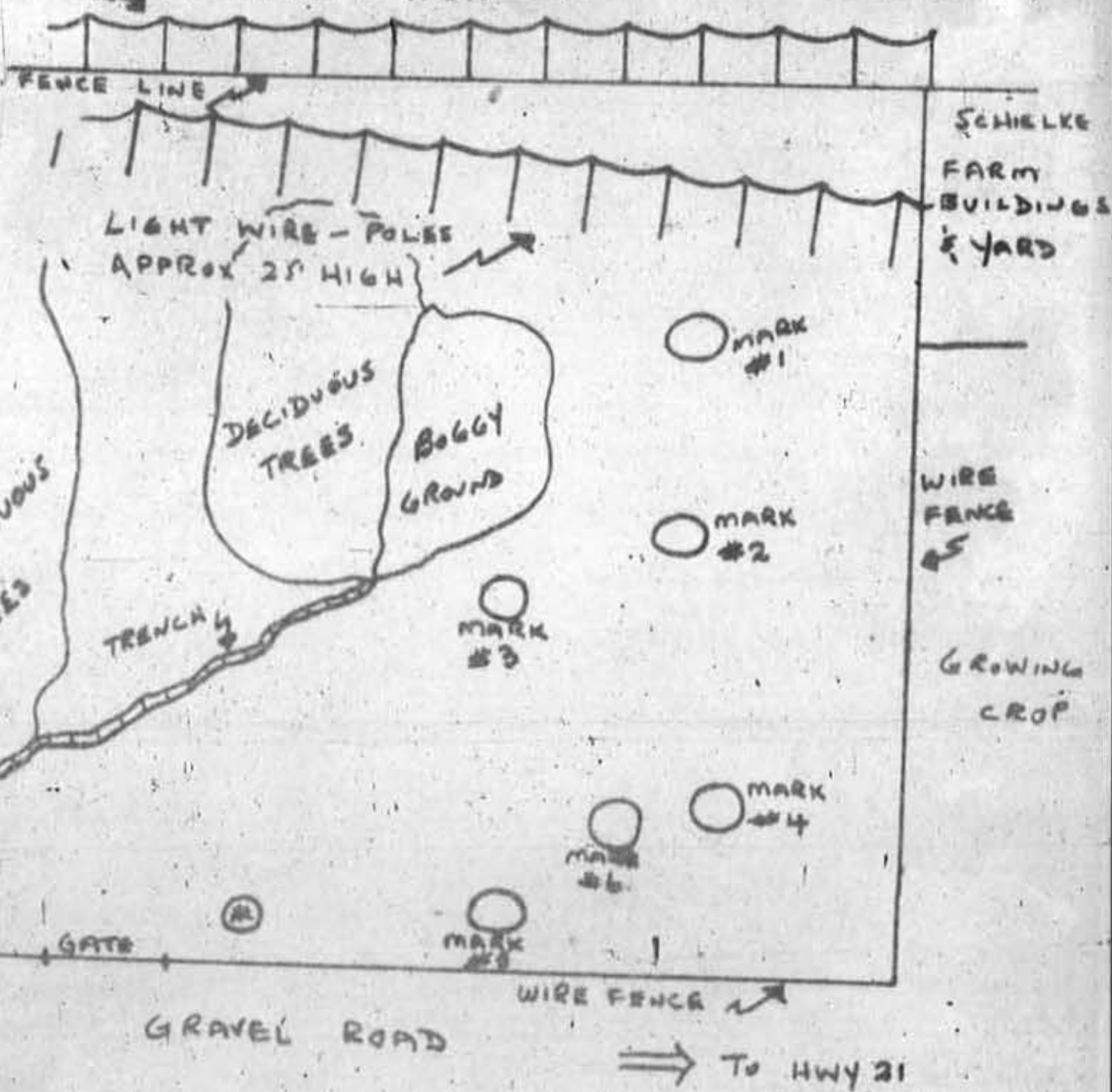



Canadian Forces Base, Edmonton

BACKGROUND

1. The writer was detailed by HQ CFB, Edmonton, to carry out an investigation and report upon certain markings on the ground in the vicinity of CAMROSE, Alberta. Contact with Mr. PATRIDGE of the Camrose Canadian to obtain specific information and liaison with the DRB Experimental Station, SUFFIELD, was ordered. Arrangements were made by telephone for Suffield to provide a Scientific Officer and, at that Officer's request, a photographer from CFB Edmonton was also taken along. Personal contact was made with Dr. GH JONES of Suffield at the Camrose airstrip and the bulk of the investigation was made in his company.
2. Capt GC WALKER and the photographer proceeded to CAMROSE and vicinity by PMC, departing Namao at 1000 hours, 11 Aug 67. After meeting Dr JONES, the party proceeded to the offices of the Camrose Canadian and met with Mr. PATRIDGE, from there all proceeded to the farm of a Mr. SCHIELKE near the village of DUHAMEL and examined the ground in question. After the departure of Dr JONES, Capt WALKER met a Mr. Ray SANDERS and as a result of information from him, proceeded back to DUHAMEL for a further visual investigation and then returned to NAMA0.
3. On 15 Aug, Capt WALKER returned to DUHAMEL and obtained soil samples as directed in a telephone call from CFBHQ Operations.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF GROUND

4. The field involved is the Southeast quarter of Section 28, Township 45, Range 21 and is owned by Mr. SCHIELKE. It is located approximately one mile South and two miles West of the village of DUHAMEL, near Alberta Highway 21. Approximately one and a half miles due North there are two large, white storage tanks. There are prominent grain elevators in the village. A sketch of the immediate quarter-section is attached as Annexure A.
5. There were a total of six circles or portions of circles in the quarter-section. These were arbitrarily numbered for ease of reference and the numbers shown on Annex A.

VERBAL INFORMATION

6. Mr. PATRIDGE was the first person contacted. He stated that he knew little first-hand information. He had been informed by Mr. Ray SANDERS of the existence of the marks and had taken photographs and written a short article for his newspaper.
7. Mr. Edgar SCHIELKE was interviewed. He stated that he had personally seen Mark #2 on the morning of Saturday, 5 August. It was of sufficient interest that he mentioned it to relatives and friends, with the end result that Mr. SANDERS became interested. Mr. SANDERS then found the other marks in the same field. Mr. SANDERS informed news media including Mr. PATRIDGE of the Camrose Canadian. Mr. SANDERS resides at SW 33, Township 45, Range 20, near Camrose. His telephone number is 672-6861.

8. Mr. SANDERS took some photographs, these were examined but had nothing to contribute and were not retained. Mr. PATRIDGE's negatives were borrowed for printing by CFB Edmonton Photo Section.

9. Various other people were mentioned in the course of these conversations as having sighted Unidentified Flying Objects in the area. None of the sightings were made in the immediate vicinity (ie, within one or two miles) and there were no mentions of sightings later than the end of June. The SCHIELKE family themselves heard or saw nothing unusual, except the marks themselves.

10. There was a rainstorm of approximately one inch on Friday, 4 August and another fall of the same amount on Monday, 7 August.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION OF VISUAL EXAMINATION

11. All the marks exhibited the same general appearance. There is a ring, six inches in width, with diameter varying from slightly over 31 feet to 36 feet. These show no visible evidence of heat, but there is a definite impression in the ground indicating distinct pressure. There is no indication of disturbance inside the ring. There is no indication of any tracks to or from the marks. There are vehicle tracks in the field but these are quite distinct from the marks in question and bear no apparent relationship. Both Mr. PATRIDGE and Mr. SANDERS stated that most of the vehicle tracks have been made since they first saw the marks, obviously by sightseers.

12. The overall impression of the rings is the same as one would expect from a snow or mud tire with lugs spaced about three inches apart. At some points along the perimeter, the impression of "lugs" is quite distinct and at others, almost non-existent. There is slight evidence of movement in a radial manner along the marks in that certain marks have the grass pressed down in a definite direction. The direction is consistent within each mark but the same between one mark and another.

13. Each mark has one portion of the circle or arc more heavily impressed at one side, but the side involved is not consistent from one mark to the other neither in relation to direction or to the height of ground. The ground has small irregularities and the grass is quite short but the marks are not more heavily impressed on the higher ground than they are on lower ground a few inches away. The impressions are definitely deeper and more distinct than tracks of cars or light trucks in the same field. The grass has been damaged, in most cases killed, but new growth is now taking place within the marks.

14. There are cattle in the field but it is not possible to say whether they have been avoiding the marks, the ground being such that no significant cattle tracks are being left. There is no evidence, physical or verbal, of any change in their habits.

15. There is no physical evidence of any damage to trees or shrubs in the field. There is no evidence that would lead to a conclusion of deliberate interference or involvement by any person. Careful scrutiny was made to determine if any centre point was marked. In one mark such a point was found with a stick pushed into the ground, but both Mr. SANDERS and Mr. PATRIDGE stated that the stick had been placed there by SANDERS himself during the process of measuring the marks. There is no evidence of chemical involvement. A survey was made by Dr. JONES with a geiger counter, but only

normal background radiation readings were obtained. There was absolutely no radiation change inside, along or well outside the rings.

16. Mark #1 - A complete circle, very regular with definite "tread" markings. Grass appears to be pressed down in a clockwise direction. At the North side, there were a few very sharply defined marks across the ring approximately one inch apart.

17. Mark #2 and Mark #3 - Complete circles, #2 slightly irregular (is, 34 feet North-South versus 36 feet East-West). Grass appears to be pressed down in a counter-clockwise direction. "Tread" markings evident in places.

18. Mark #4 - Slightly more than half of a circle evident. Grass appears to be pressed down in a counter-clockwise direction. "Tread" markings evident in places. Two small areas of sod removed by Mr. SANDERS and taken to Emergency Measures Organization in EDMONTON. (Mr. SANDERS stated these samples were examined at the University of Alberta. In view of samples taken by myself, it was not considered worthwhile to pursue this.)

19. Mark #5 and Mark #6 - Less than half of a circle evident. Markings less distinct than in the other marks. Unable to determine direction of collapse of the grass.

20. At the point marked with a star on Annex A, there was an indistinct arc on the ground, but it was impossible to determine whether this was, in fact, a mark similar to the others, or whether it was merely coincidental.

21. Particular attention was paid to surrounding fields from the car while travelling in the area. Some of these fields were freshly ploughed and others were in crop. There was no evidence of interference in any other fields.

1. On the 8 August 1967 CFHQ received a UFO report from Casinofe Edmonton stating that four depressions had been made in the soil of a pasture in the Duhamel area, Camrose, Alberta. The four depressions, in the form of rings, suggested that some unknown large round objects had settled into the ground. The rings covered an estimated diameter of some 34 to 36 feet. The outer edges of the circles contained clearly marked teeth or claw like marks. The informant further advised that photographs had been taken of the imprints.
2. On the 9 August, CFHQ instructed CFB Edmonton to investigate the subject UFO report and to obtain copies of the photographs as part of the report to be forwarded to CFHQ/DCFS for study. In addition, CFB Edmonton was instructed to contact DND Experimental Station at Hainston, Alberta for scientific assistance in carrying out the investigation.
3. In view of a recent UFO investigation carried out by DND in the Falcon Lake area, 90 miles east of Winnipeg, Manitoba in which soil samples taken from an alleged UFO landing area indicated a higher than normal radium count, it was deemed advisable to instruct CFB Edmonton to obtain soil samples for testing purposes from the pasture area.
4. The investigation report, photographs and soil samples were received at CFHQ on the 18 August 1967. The soil samples are presently being tested for foreign matter and a report is expected shortly.
5. The report indicates that the pasture area was visited by the DND Investigating Officer and Dr GH Jones from the DND Experimental Station, Suffield. A total of six circles or portions of circles, six inches in width and varying in diameter from slightly over 31 feet to 36 feet were clearly visible to the naked eye. The marks showed no signs of heat but the impressions in the ground indicated distinct pressure. An examination of the surrounding grounds gave no indication of tracks or marks leading to or from the impressions. The grass in the impression areas has been damaged and in most cases killed, but new growth is now taking place within the marks. There is no obvious physical damage to trees or shrubs in the field; nor is there any evidence which would lead to the conclusion of deliberate involvement by any person. A survey made by Dr Jones with a geiger counter disclosed no unusual radiation readings. Interviews with

a number of persons residing in the general area indicates that UFOs had been sighted in areas some two miles away from the pasture prior to the end of the month of June 1967. However, no recent UFO or unusual aerial sightings were observed during the period in question.

6. The report has been studied by members of the Operation Staff and Mr Greenwood, Director of Scientific Co-ordination in an attempt to arrive at an acceptable explanation as to what may have caused these mystery marks. From the available evidence it has not been possible to arrive at a conclusion.

7. Until the soil sample tests are concluded it will not be possible to say as to whether or not a type of fungus was responsible for the marks in question. However, the impressions which indicate a source of distinct pressure would hardly be related to a fungus action. The marks in question were not caused by a Canadian military vehicle, nor to the best of our knowledge, by a vehicle operated by either a friendly or unfriendly nation.

1. Two sets of soil samples were removed from the area in question, one by the DND investigating officer and one by Mr Ray Sanders of Camrose, Alberta. The DND soil analysis divulged nothing abnormal in or about the soil. The sample taken by Mr Sanders was not analyzed by the University of Alberta as the area of investigation had been subjected to heavy rains for several weeks prior to the extraction of the soil samples.
2. The weight bearing capacity of the local terrain was not calculated as to do this accurately would involve heavy and expensive equipment not readily available in the area. The actual weight of any possible vehicle can only be estimated as being heavier than an automobile or light truck.
3. DND is unable to arrive at a solution as to what caused the impression on the property of Mr Ed Schielke of Dunham, Alberta.







I do not know if there is any official interest in U.F.O. reports but if there is I should like to report an unusual sighting as told to me by my ten year old son.

At approximately 2107 hours Pacific Daylight time on 30 Aug he saw from his open bedroom window what he told me at first was a satellite. However further questioning revealed that the object was about half the diameter of the full moon, circular in shape and of a dull luminescent green. Atop the object was a much brighter but smaller green light. According to the boy it moved fairly fast in a south westerly direction, and seemed to be very high. It emitted no sound.


The evening of the 30th was clear with a slight smoke haze and plenty of stars visible, there was no wind to mask any noise and the street, at the time, was quiet.

At first I thought he might have seen the starboard nav light and exhaust flare of CPA's DC6-B which climbs out of Kelowna every evening around that time, but this aircraft appeared some fifteen minutes later, on the same course but quite low and emitting very large amounts of noise.

Having been a Ground Observer Corps Officer and being currently PAIC of the local Air Cadet Squadron I realize that although official policy is sometimes not announced, nevertheless every clue to this kind of thing is helpful.

Incidentally my son is a Cub and reasonably observant and repeated retelling of this story through different lines of questioning has brought out the same answers each time. I believe him implicitly.


